The reality is that for many of us, these questions are impossible to answer.

The backstories of our food are shrouded in mystery, often unfolding in shadow places, Val Plumwood's term for places we rely on but don't know, and which bear the brunt of environmental degradation.

The ability to make informed choices about our food is 1 aspect of food sovereignty.

More broadly, food sovereignty is the right to define our own food systems and to access healthy, culturally appropriate food that is produced sustainably rather than the demands of the market and corporations.

Food sovereignty puts the needs of the people who produce and consume food at the heart of food systems and policy.

It's key to addressing the overlapping crises of climate, hunger and inequality.

Despite this, it's likely you don't hear the term food sovereignty around much.

The food system accounts for about 25% of total greenhouse gas emissions, yet it's commonly left out of discussions about the climate emergency.

Over half of the land on this continent is used for agriculture, but rarely do we bring food and farming into land backed discussions, as a climate solution, as a Nexus of decolonisation, as a battleground for workers rights and more.

Food is so close, so ever present, we can forget to pay attention.

There are of course exceptions, individuals and communities who are working to fix what's fixable, halt what's causing harm and build better food systems.

This episode is an in depth feature on Brazil's Landless Workers Movement, also known as MST, a champion of food sovereignty for over 40 years, which has been instrumental in its development into a global movement.

Through its story, you will hear how struggles for land, social transformation and human emancipation converge in the food sovereignty movement.

Calling into a recent food sovereignty convergence in Narm Melbourne, here's Anna Cha, member of the National Coordinators Network of the Landless Workers Movement, about how it came to be and its vision for the food system in Brazil and beyond.

So in Brazil, the question of access to land and, and the ownership of land has always been a very important issue.

And we, we usually, we used to say that the question of land, it's in the route even today of the great social inequality that exists in our country for you to have a dimension of what that means.

Still today, 1% of the land owners own more than 50% of all the land in Brazil.

So it's very concentrated, the land.

And on the other hand, we still have more than 5 million landless people who could potentially live and work in the land.

So the struggle for land has always been in part of our historical struggles, whether it's in colonial times, the struggle of the indigenous people, but also the struggle of peoples who were enslaved and who even sought the right to create free communities which were called Columbus [Spelling]

That still until today are a great inspiration for for all of us who who believe the land should fulfil a social function and not to be in the hands of just a few people.

But even after the legal signature of the end of slavery, the land was never been democratised and remain in the hands of those few land owners which usually were politicians or very rich people.

So it's in this process of struggles for land that MSD emerged 41 years ago.

It was in 1984, the foundation of our movement and Brazil leaves a moment of redemiration.

We have had 21 years military dictatorship and it was a very difficult moment for all those who leave and try to to build a different perspective of what were that moment in government.

And so there was a lot of persecution against all leftist political organisations and especially also social movements, peasant movements.

But MSC merged as a social movement that struggled for land.

But also since the beginning it was the movement who was claiming for a project of Agri reform and had a perspective of social transformation and human emancipation.

So land was the first goal, the 1st even necessity of people who join MST.

Landless people usually are very poor people because they don't have the the means of projections to to are able to survive from their work.

So they join MST in this goal to to have a small piece of land to produce.

But since the beginning the the movement had in this perspective a biggest goal of social transformation.

So when Amnesty joined together with other social movements, especially peasant movements, also some indigenous movements from all over the world, and they found the LA via Campesina, which is this international network that defends the right of peasants defence a a perspective of agriculture on agricology principles.

And of course, one of the pillars of, of the, of the, the struggle of the programme of La Vie Campesina, it's food sovereignty, which is very basically the right to decide what to produce, how to produce and for whom to produce.

And doing that we are also saying that we need to decide what we want to eat.

No, So food cannot be a commodity.

Food, it's a human right.

And of course, not just for the peasants, but for all people in Brazil, the agriculture system is dominated by Agri business companies and also some Latifun juice.

These huge amount of land who are owned by just a few landowner.

And what is the result of this concentration of land and this so unequal distribution of of land?

Well, the result is the growing of hunger.

The food we eat, it's full of poisons.

We are seeing that our soil, the countryside environment is being destroyed and and even the people in the city, they became hostage of ultra possessive and expensive and unhealthy food, even if sometimes that food is laid has healthy food or food for from the future or whatever.

So it's a combination of the model of producing from Agri business sector, but also this huge cultural industry and propaganda machine that makes people believe that this kind of way of producing and doing agriculture, it's, it's the right way and it's the most modern and it's what we need to support.

So it's a very concrete struggle for land and for having the means of production and the means of doing agriculture.

But it's also a struggle in, in the subject subjective ways.

It's, it's a struggle for who defines the imaginary of what is fair, what is healthy, what is good for everybody.

And in in our case, what is what is the model of agriculture that we should have society support.

So our struggle and what we are proposing is that the model of Agri business, this agriculture that is based on monoculture that is based on producing with, with pesticides, with poison, this way of producing to export and not to, to, to, to feed an internal market and, and feed the people.

We believe that it's not a good option for our society, not even in Brazil, not in any other country of the world.

And in opposed to that, we are proposing what we are calling people's agrarian reform.

When MSD was found in our programme, we wish to say that we are fighting for agrarian reform in a classic way of of thinking, agrarian reform basically redistribute lands for those who don't have land and want to work on land and plant on land.

But with the advance of all the capitalist system, with the advance of Agri business, we somehow redefined that term of a grammar reform.

And we say now what makes sense for us is to talk about people's agreement reform and what what is just the difference?

The difference is it's not just the land that need to be redistribute.

We need to build a new country project and that has land, has one of the the main course, but land to be produced with based on agricology in the respect of nature, in the respect of peasant culture, peasant food culture and people's control of territories.

And of course, that means we need to have autonomy to produce.

We need to make our production based on collective work, on equal participation of men and women, with peasant education, with the sharing of ancestral knowledge, but also with technology.

We used to say it's make the countryside again a, a good place to live, a place not just to produce commodities, but a place where it's good to live.

So this is our one of our greatest slogans that people's agrarian reform, it's a way of living better and not just in the countryside.

Because if we are saying we are going to produce good food, healthy food, food produced based on non oppressed relations, we truly believe that the way that food will be received and for the people in the city, it will improve the life of everybody.

Today, Anna Char of the Landless Workers Movement is sharing about the fight for better food systems in Brazil and the growth of a global food sovereignty movement.

Here she is again going deeper into the goals and challenges of the movement for people's agrarian reform.

And but it's not an easy to ask if it was Agri business didn't was not having so much power as it has nowadays, not just in Brazil, but as I was saying in many parts of the world.

And that's why we also believe and it's one of the principles of MST that builds international solidarity, builds internationalism.

It's a, a, a very important part of our struggle.

We really believe that just our struggle won't build good sovereignty even just in Brazil because it's a collective struggle.

It's an international struggle.

The same way the our enemy, the Agri business companies, the Nope.

And now looking in a broader sense to to what is happening in the world.

Also the the neo fascist ideas and programmes and and then violence are international and are acting connected in different countries.

So we also need to make our struggle connected with other parts of the world, connected with people who have the the same questions, the same problems, but also share ideas, also share projects, also also share experiences to overcome this, this situation and to make the the struggle for food sovereignty, but also for people's sovereignty.

So that's very important for us.

That's why MST since the beginning joined different networks, especially of, of peasant and, and organisations.

But not just we are also part of the People's International Assembly and other, other networks.

Because we truly believe that our struggle should be internationalist.

And that's the, the way of, of trying to, to overcome all, all the, the problems that we have.

Just to mention some of the, the major challenges that we not just as MST, but also as La Vic Campesina we faced and, and we need to invest and put our strength on, on, on them to build food sovereignty as a global and a strategic project.

So I will, I will mention some of, of that goals.

Of course, they are many, many.

So the first one, I I mentioned it a lot already.

It's to fight against Latifundu, it's the fight against land concentration and to fight against Agri business corporations, which means to propose programmes of people's Agri reform.

It means to propose policies that can redistribute land, but also propose the idea of a good of the countryside to be a good place to live.

A second big challenge is to produce healthy food, but healthy food in quality but also in quantity, because we need to feed the entire population.

Everybody has the right to eat healthy food, food that is not produced with poison, food who was produced by in a agroecology way and manner.

We need to fight against hunger in in our societies and that is part of of our task.

But it's we need to do that with any kind of food.

We need to that and we believe that it's possible to stop hunger, but with healthy foods so that people can not just feed themselves with any kind of food, but with food with that will promote them to have a healthy life and and be able to to develop all the potentialities that they have as human beings all over the world.

A third challenge that I could mention is the challenge of produce new relationships between those who produce food.

Those who consume it between those who produce foods that we don't have, gender inequalities, that we don't have racism, we don't have any kind of oppressions of any type.

So for us that is very important.

We cannot say that we are producing and we are deciding what kind of food we should produce if the way we produce that food reproduces some of the the major problems in society has racism or machismo or other kind of of inequalities among the human beings in general.

So for us it's very important the idea to valorise all those who who are producers and try to build different ways and more equal relations among them.

A fourth challenge it has to be with the idea that food is not a commodity.

And if it's not a commodity, we need to warranty new and fair regulations so that we know we don't have speculations on commercialization of food or any kind of other speculations of food that we know.

That only makes that a big part of the population have not access to those food because the food becomes a commodity for us.

A very, very other important challenge is how to plant, how to produce food, but protecting our forests, protecting our waters, protecting environmental reserves.

So in MST but also in some organisations, Olivia Campesina, we have this huge campaign that is called Plant Trees and Produce Healthy Food.

So we have this initiative of and a plan of planting thousands of, of trees in the next 10 years that we truly believe that it, it is with practical actions that we will fight and we will confront the, the climate exchange and not just with Peaches or even with some agreements that we are seeing that don't, don't produce any practical results.

In this, in this sense, very important for us is to strength the peasant culture, a culture that also have a lot of joy on it, that sings life sings the work that we do that also produce art, produce food culture.

It connects the past and the ancestral perspectives and and knowledges with the present and with the future.

We believe in that sense that a very, very important thing it's how to protect and produce healthy seeds and together with that to fight against the companies that produce genetic and transformed seeds.

So La Via Campesina has this important and since many years campaign called seeds, a patrimony of people serving humanity and to live.

It has a final message, the idea of building international solidarity among among people, among the peasants, to build alliance with the peasants, with those who live in the countryside, who live in the forest, who who live and and dedicate their lives to to produce and to transform also the the waters, but also with the people and the workers who live in the city.

So for us, it's very important this this class alliance also with the workers of the city.

So solidarity, it's for us, it's not just an idea, it's a practical action.

And it's also a need that we have has peasants and as working class international solidarity.

It's about exchanging seeds, for instance, but also as we are doing here, exchanging ideas.

It's for us about defending Palestine, defending the indigenous people of the world.

It's about making food a symbol of resistance and of of unity between people.
