But we all know that sadly sometimes people as we call it family of origin is a term that gets used cannot be supportive of their LGBT I loved ones and is someone over time who's been to will save funeral and similar services?

Services where there has been transphobia or biphobia or by Erasure Etc. It's very very horrible. And of course from the transport of view when the unsupportive family take over and you say a past name and pronouns, it's horrible. I have seen a shift over time towards that and I've seen compromises at one funeral where the trans woman came out later in life had been a parent to three children. They work to compromise the oldest

Water sort of spoke up and said look, I loved my debt and love my dad, but I hated all use the name Jennifer because that wasn't the name used and that's fair. You know, their oldest daughter has a right to all her authentic feelings, but you can find a way to just do it. That doesn't pass name anyone and I think that was really well done. So it shows that these are the sort of issues that might need to be organized. One of the issues that came up yesterday is if the client is the person paying you

Is your obligation to them or is it to the deceased will sadly dead people don't have a lot of rights when it comes to this stuff. So the Salette create critical solution a couple of points here. Make sure if you're over 18 that you have people in place power of attorney medical attorney and most of all executor. I know no one wants to think about dying but I think the last I heard it happens to all of us and if you've got a supportive executor who will stand up and be assertive and say no

You can only use the person's current name and pronouns are not passed names and pronouns then you're then you're in a and that's the way to do it. And if you want to have rainbow colored cake or by colored cake and or trans colored cake. I want all my cake and I want my friends to eat it too. Then you can those sorts of things and of course having end not just end-of-life directives. But of course Wills on open until say at least three weeks after a person is deceased. So there needs to be clear instructions.

Given to an Executor and look this is not legal advice. I know there has been one legal case from this in Victoria, but I can't see how it would hurt. If some if the where possible the person reads out the will as well as having all the documented and signed paperwork and the camera on your smartphone and there's going to be a pun pans across to the executor and a witness now that's got to mean something like I don't see how you could really discount that so these

The things you can do to make sure that you're queer Community can celebrate all of their friend and I've got to say sadly. When well, we lost someone too early in the by Community about three years ago through health reasons and on a better note the person sister got in touch with Victorian by communities and said look, we know that this was an important part of x's life and we had a picture of X with a by Banner behind X at a community event.

Vent and when it came up as we do nowadays on the slide show that the the the memorial service, you know, it just helped us remember our friend and it helped clear the grief out. So, you know, it is important that these things happen. So yeah things still happening along and rovings come in and said nice work Millennial. Yes, good Community work. I mean police with new powers is also very dangerous for those sections of the communities traditionally subjected to over policing join us for the launch of a new state.

And now we've just seen so many double standards on this in the situation over the period of covid and how people have played on a commercial media and right-wingers saying that the black lives matter protests spread covid-19 was no evidence of that whatsoever. But now we've got all these

So people going on about individual freedom and there could be this happening at this time talking about sort of, you know, sort of talking about their freedom just because they want it and yeah, they have had to be cracked down on but you know, it's sort of very quickly during the week. We've had a number of situations involving mental people with experiencing mental injury issues and police responses, and it was very

Disconcerting to see the police Union so we'll maybe we shouldn't be approaching people with mental health issues know you learn how to do it and one of our regular

contributors to the program Kayleen reminded me that they said similar things about trans people in the 90s police. You've got to learn to deal with things on the merits and the police Union is blocking our anti-discrimination laws if that's a real problematic approach and I think it's time the police Union worked a little more cooperatively and warmly with

I'm diversity rather than the sort of Macho attitudes. It appears. We are seeing and that's a debate for a very big debate for another time and also brings up issues of do you achieve change from the inside or the outside but or as well, there's an old saying which I thought J r-- Ewing made famous keep your friends close, but your enemies closer, who knows what I don't want to see the police Union has enemies but they're going to have to start working a little more cooperatively and warmly with

Diversity in my opinion but that is a note that we have to consider will consider it more in more in detail down the track, but for the rest of the next few days enjoy celebrate by week and all the puns are reminded that there is a competition for event for the best pun during standby US events and a hint there could be a Pun song at these closing ceremony.
