After hate to bring up the queer phobia which is one of the content warnings that we need to give for this discussion of this topic or quit and or query raise you if you want to put it that way, the 2016 census where if you wanted to put a gender identity of other than male or female or sex, you had to ring up and get a password and of course, given the shenanigans overall with the census situation then that was getting very difficult and of course the language is an inclusive now,

How do you do it in plain language terms? Make sure that you have, you know, male female and then please specify freeform. Anyone can put it whatever they want and prefer not to specify G. Not that hard. You wouldn't think. So and there's this thing called the federal sex Discrimination Act Amendment 2013 which actually has its 80th birthday

today since it came into effect. Forgot about that for a second which says we're not to discriminate.

Eight in this country, on the basis of sexual orientation, gender, identity and intersex. But we won't include them in a census. There's also that thing called the Australian Bureau of Statistics standards on in these areas which have been willfully disobeyed. Oh, never mind what this is. So I can understand totally that many people will feel that this census is parts of Igbtiq. A+ phobic. It's not very well put together at all.

There's been lots of good work done by queer advocacy groups, Igbtiq Health, Australia formerly, the Igbti Health Alliance just equal the community based National advocacy group, the quality Australian, the more corporate-funded Lobby group, all sorts of organizations everywhere, speaking up, signing petitions, all those sorts of things. And so once again this government shows itself to be out of touch with the Grassroots

The population who probably just warned fairness. It's not that hard and if you listen and if you come up with win-win Solutions it can be done. So a pretty poor. You know, a lot of queer people are but I'll use the word mistrust full of those in Authority, you know, it's not, it's funny 40.

Ago. And that's not a very big part of a lifetime for a lot of people that the first Mardi Gras, which was not a sort of cover yourself in biodegradable, glitter. And part, A, it was a riot and people were beaten up in the name of authority and law. Yeah, sure. And all the rest of it. So now people have a weariness, if I can put it that way of authority in our communities, and let's say that

The data is kept, let's say a tramp person person, I'll just lay person X who will say, for argument's sake is assigned, female at Birth transitions later and assumes a male or you know, non-binary identity now and that data gets mixed up and let's look at something, let's say because of the census, they get mailed, something under their old name, their old gender in a share house, where they're not out or somewhere where they're not out and they routed that could put them at risk.

How do we know that this is going to be treated respectfully? I don't want to fear Monger. These are things that have happened with data and when it's not used carefully and respectfully, and respecting diversity as we sort of heard in a way in that Community announcement on algorithms, there's also the other thing that the other point I wanted to raise particularly in relation to gender identity in my best imitation commercial radio TalkBack caller voice. Mm. No it's perhaps not so much a Content warning.

But a brown paper bag. Warning are this non-binary thing. It's just a fad. When I was young we just listen to The Beatles and we thought that was enough and I seriously not true. Of course, there's all sorts of debates. One of the classic tactics of people who would Hap's have be in our opinion, not respectful of minority groups deny the group exists. Deny, the numbers are what they really are do.

At the issues that exist well you know the census therefore is denying that creates the proverbial Vicious Circle or angry parallelogram or something like that in that you know they'll say well there's no lgbti people will you didn't blow the rulers did you so not helpful and the

Problem that we face is that when we do have these situations of not having the data, it creates problems. Now, how are we going to create Health? You know, it's help inclusive Health Services. If we don't know how many people there are and perhaps where they are, that could be in mean, we could, you know, do good targeting. Good algorithms if you like, if we know that sure, we all know, Igbtqa+, including transgender diverse non-binary, people can be everywhere.

You know that would make sense to some extent if we're going to have clinics let's put them in areas where we know they are but we won't know now in terms of those numbers and you to pieces of research I know of one from New Zealand and one from Belgium and Flanders so we're almost literally talking opposite sides of the world quite a conservative estimate of the trans and gender diverse population at one point two percent. Well I got some news for you. I out as part of the things I do Beyond this program, do some work with people who teach respect in schools and I heard from one person in this area, the other day, they are doing some work in. What? A school, that calls itself single-sex in inverted, commas, sick, something like that. And so the number of people who are identifying as non-binary and or the gender not expected of that single-sex school. If I can put it that way, eight, percent of one year alone from what surveys that have been done. So, did you say it's 1%? Of course. And of course it doesn't matter what the number is respect is needed for everyone in absolute totality. Let's give an example, I'm of Jewish background. We according to the last census and we had a box, we could tick point for of 1% of the population. Imagine if someone said I will do is people we're not going to put you in this time, ring up. If you want to go and have yourself included properly, they'd be an uproar.

So there's a huge amount of double standards going on and it doesn't help. So you've sort of, in terms of gender, you have to. If you are someone who comes under the trans /, gender diverse umbrella, you've sort of got to make your own call as to how you fill this out because female without asking about how assigned at Birth then say a raises trans women in its to some extent. If you know, for a lot of people some of us would might be okay to put down effectively say that we're

Trans and similarly for Trans men. So we're not going to get a very appropriate number and, of course, the right RN, what is it? RW? N J's will seize on this. Now, he hadn't a message in from Kayleen, which came in. And when Kayleen quote, I emailed the ABS about the census. They said they've consulted with LGBT groups. Wouldn't say which ones will take me some time to find the email, but we'll try to do so this week.
