I started by plus experience of HIV prevention and health care has had an extraordinary amount of work done by a colleague in and a couple of colleagues and a group of pretty incredible people this year. So to bring it to a focus to have a spot light Shone on it, to be able to discuss the despero the disparity in

Health Services, the language that's used and the research that's done on HIV prevention. And Health Care is often non-inclusive and sometimes very alienating for by plus people by plus men, women and non-binary and trans people. So this particular session is it's been presented previously.

This year. I'm Amber. You'll have to correct me if it's one or two times professionally, this great. Thank you this year and the feedback and the exposure. For this particular session is so incredibly important to the community, but it's also incredibly important to health care workers and government departments because we can put our hand up all the time and say that we're not being represented.

Then getting information and getting the right research done. It's almost like a bit of an intervention within Healthcare to make sure that they use inclusive language and they mean it so and also that they have considerations across the spectrums of sexuality. And as we said earlier, in the program bisexuality, do makeup does make up the highest percentage in the rainbow so it can no longer be ignored. So,

So, I really highly recommend the by past experiences of HIV HIV prevention. And Healthcare. It does sound heavy, but it is real and it is really important. Absolutely. Absolutely. Yeah, and so yet many many intersections to sort of come across there and also just going to The Wider World a second. The roadmap is continuing, as we as announced in Victoria.

With gradual reopening. But as for a multitasking is reaching its peak there, but thanks for the update. Some hopefully who was also Amazed by the Huns support of little nurse. And also one person's costume at the Met. Gala was made by a trans Creator, which I'm proving, of course, how creative binary busting people are. And there's also a lot of discussion, you know, sort of on this panel on this, for stand by us that so much of the bi plus, and

Trans and gender diverse communities, sort of have this. Jen - Mentor approach if we can throw in some Jewish stuff as well there. But, you know, it's sort of because we both sort of have to get past very limiting ideas about gender. There's I think there's lots of stuff on the on the on the on the if throughout the conference that sort of comes to that intersection as well. And you know Sis Sis by plus people trans and gender diverse by plus people both equally important, but

Yeah, there's that sort of potential for double marginalization which stops the double magnificence. It's really important that we do some Ultra, binary busting throughout the conference. So lots of great panels like nervo and others Amber.

Something that I really loved about what comes to the front of the stand by us conference is that there isn't one way to be by plus. And I think that comes through in the variety of sessions that we've got, and in all of the spaces where we highlight those intersections. And to me, that, that really

Reminds me of the power of authentic representation and being able to be in spaces that are by and for community. And I think there's a lot of power in that and so that's something I'm really really looking forward to in this upcoming week. Definitely. I think there is a huge, a huge range of those spaces and just to sort of throw in more of the sort of social events. We've got just having a look at the program at stand.

By us.com, we have games and pets as well as Rebecca mentioned books as well, as well as the by music and musings. And yes, I buy and ambach pentameter.
