And I do use the word expectations and also there is patriarchy and definitely, we need to consider those things.

Acknowledge that a lot of women have had to fight very, very hard to get to where they are and get things better by whatever degree for women. Where I have a problem here is that sometimes that can lead to a very gender stereo typical model of these issues and maybe some of our recurring listeners in all seriousness are aware of these issues and haven't thought about it, but the problem is, you know, there are

Bad. And the majority of violence does appear, then that, you know, sort of an element of badly behaved cishet men, perpetrate on to cishet women and children. The problem is badly, behaved people can perpetrate on two innocent people of any background and I wanted to talk about this and this is where I'll just raise up for Content. Warning again. You are welcome to tune out although I want to say hi, but just before I go into this mellie's listing, as about to head off, to the queer Exhibition at the National Gallery.

As an accountant and my direct report was someone who's far as I know, was a cisgender woman. Interestingly, who claim to be a feminist claimed? She'd face discrimination getting to the role above me and she may well have on keeping it neutral as I can. But then behaved in exactly the same way as the second in charge of a particular section who whose Behavior no doubt was that of a toxic masculinity cisgender male? I remember

Time when I even offered a suggestion, I was told that I was snotty and impertinent, believe it or not, just for offering an idea and of course, but she was also one of these people who was a bit of a control freak and so everything had to be done. When where? Who how why her way and there's lots of managers like that of all genders, but that's interesting thing. Interestingly this organization, which doesn't exist anymore, but I still

I won't name it was in and yes, it was a corporate or part of a corporate group. But it did do was trying to do some things in relation to aged care in terms of combating discrimination, against older people and attitudes and it was quite ironic that these two people would often from memory. Sometimes have arguments in team meetings about gender. And then go on to talk about how we should stop age discrimination as I call that selectively woke and there's lots of people out

They who are thin. As I mentioned. I came out. I started getting involved in the rainbow communities and just one small example of microaggression one of those things that happens so many times and gets repeated as an accountant. I've had gay men talk across million emails and about me. But without asking me about things and making decisions for me and I've had straight men when I was still working more as an accountant as Auditors, come into an otherwise, good work place and start.

That man splaining accounting to me because suddenly I lost all my accounting knowledge after I filmed my gender identity as a woman, but I've also had a well-known trans man. Tell me what I said when I didn't say it. And tell me that I didn't say something. When I did more, man, splaining. I've had a transwoman be highly abusive, to me in a workplace, including outright discrimination based on my neural processing. And when I refer to the behavior as toxic masculinity lowa's,

The response to the Apparently always misgendering here. I've had a cisgender lesbian lecture, me and on it goes I've had non-binary people abused me. So is it all about a an abuse of power? We need to consider the power of patriarchal Ford and how much the influences our society. And some women do take it on unconsciously, but some think that's the only way they're going to head to head and make a conscious decision. Some however, stick to their

Simples and well, to quote, John Cena rise above hate. So, and it was interesting as I was having these thoughts over the last few days. There were so many things that came in the regular column that I subscribe to from our model, we of the Guardian the week in patriarchy touched on this last night. I mean, Elon Musk. Everyone's favorite, nice guy. I'm sorry. And I sort of said he would challenge Vladimir.

To a duel. Now, if a women to sort of sort out, the Ukraine situation, which is of course, utterly stupid, but if a woman behave that way that instantly be ridiculed and judged. But Elon is somehow taken, seriously, which shows we have a pretty low bar when it comes to, you know, because of the patriarchy that patriarchal be patriarchal, he behaved sis men put in power. Well, yeah, there's lots of double standards there can be. Of course, the concept of internal,

Wised. Misogyny is MM where people only see limited environments and limited ways to use power. And that is often misuse of power and that I think is so critical. So what on Earth do we need to do to start fixing this? I think that we do have to acknowledge one thing that often things that Stan seem aggressive can come from a place of trauma. So I think we need to do more about having trauma-informed, sort of work workplaces.

And certainly in marginalized communities and organizations that represent them. I only speak for broadly for Igbtiq a plus, but we also everyone needs to keep learning and I

think one other thing we can do is also listen, be careful. You don't assume because someone yells that it is abuse. It might be a from a state of trauma, but bottom line is, everyone needs to just keep lifting ourselves and trying to come more from a place of kindness. I'd welcome people's thoughts. One has come.

Come in already, Mel double tasking as preparing to head off, to the fabulous. We're a proud Aboriginal woman who broadcast on SBS and a great reception and some great conversations head.

I then went down to a an event at the Australian Services Union, where I spoke and I've been an Australian Services Union member now. It's probably around 15 years. And now I'm self-employed. You might say, why do I keep the membership up? I feel that is a contribution to a strong union movement, and they've been very helpful to me in some difficult situations where I needed some support and so, it's great to contribute their.

And then I had the honor of speaking at the international women's day. Rally on the steps of the treasury building down in Collins Street.

In a walk through the city and thank heavens for my rainbow boots, which were both glamorous and comfortable, but it was very powerful and empowering to have be a part of those events. What have I done to challenge my own unconscious? Biases? I feel Mel has asked me. Do I have suggestions, books? I've read training sessions. I can recommend. Well, yes, one I did the training by The Fabulous, people at the Victorian. Aboriginal

Aboriginal Child Care Agency vacher, we love a good acronym here in the community sector, seriously. Amazing training and look there were just things I hadn't known. I might give away the particular exercise, if you go and do the training, which the time I did it in late, 2019 or the latter part thereof from memory, of course, times fogged out in the last few years, you know, just things that I'd never hurt and thought about that also felt

Right aged by what had happened and I'm sure Aboriginal and Torres Strait. Islander people feel more enraged but it's about then using that rage for good and not evil purposes and in a good and kind way. And it just made me want to try to do better books. I've read on unconscious bias. Not quite on unconscious bias directly, but what I've read recently which I highly recommend is called Atomic habits, which, you know, sort of all, we all want to change habits. Maybe now, eat better exercise.

And more those sorts of things. And because our system is programmed in a certain way. We don't break down the habits that we have, and we give up. Well, in that case, you could say unconscious bias is a habit. And I'd really recommend this book Atomic Habits by James Clear, which is really awesome. But I think the thing that I've just tried to do is keep working through my own block, smell and unblocking them and leaving myself more open, which I think is something we all have to take responsibility to do in this area and it was interesting.

That that theme certainly was mentioned on the panel on by all or most of the participants at that Manningham panel that I mentioned and thank you to City of Manningham for hosting me and wonderful coffee and Hospitality as well. Lots of things

therefore going on. I also was up at chill out last weekend. Awesome to be up there. Beautiful weather, a fabulous March.

In the the town center and then down to Victoria Park for the chill-out. Carnival day. I was there officially representing bisexual Alliance, but lots of networking which is really good. And this was something we touched on earlier. Wombats tweet was right on the button about Regional differences and it's something that had I been a little more alert. It was an early start and I began to run out of puff. I would have pulled out my little MP3 recorder and asked people what

Things similarities and differences between Metro particularly in a Metro. And then once we get further out, and there are certainly differences, you know, there's issues as wombat said in the earlier email with police and also Now sort of, I remember hearing a panel on last trans day of visibility, and noting that next Sunday is trans day of audibility on, 3cr starting with this program at noon.

And Regional panel, which talked about the lack of say, queer, friendly. Hairdressers was just one example, you know, sort of someone goes in on, are you can't have that cut, whereas, there will, possibly would be more options in this is e, so all sorts of service provision and I'm else to come in. On unconscious bias. My mum says she reads books by black authors. I think that's a fair point. We can all look at things beyond our own experience and find ways to do it better.

Um, so yeah, there's a big issue there and they have a think about what? I still must earn it. Sorry 3cr management. I haven't made up my mind what I'm going to do next week. It might just be a regular show, but if I can get some binary busting guests to join me, what are the things that we still need to do for Trans and gender diverse people and possibly many others. And also we could look at the intersections of trans and by that's a big one. That's emerging a lot as well. So yep, International

Amin stay chill out. Also, lots of other things. I forgot to thank the crew from out of the blue, James & Co diving deep for the Marine use as they always do in Winter snorkeling on the Monday, Labor Day holiday at Jawbone, Sanctuary off Williamstown, beautiful Clear Water warmed, a little scary Sally. Who used to go fishing with Dad, got saw to

banjo sharks and had childhood small, childhood traumas, come back up. Seriously a wonderful day. And I've total cultural diversity, just to finish on a high cultural note on the

Did I before chill out? I went to Melbourne City wrestling. It's the first australian-based wrestling show. I've been to since the old days or Festival Hall on a Saturday night and I had an absolute ball. And now, apart from the personal enjoyment. I do have to say one thing that really impressed me. Was that prior to the show starting? They had a prerecorded message, about everyone's safety by with all the stars and people sort of saying a message and how to knowledge meant of country. And that's the first ever wrestling show that I've ever.

The scene had that has done that and I think WWE, if you come back eventually and some point you need to do that as well. Or if aw comes out here, that sort of thing. It would be really nice. If the big companies from around the world acknowledge that when they came here also broke a drought on Thursday night. I went to my first AFL men's game in 25 years. When I was going through my journeys of gender and sexuality way back in the mid to late 90s.

Going to AFL still living as a male and hearing sexism racism homophobia. It was very off-putting in it. Just put me off for a long time, but I went with two friends.
