But if I had a bit of support quality, we could then be sitting down with them fairly soon to say. Okay, what's going to be on your agenda? And how can we work together in order to be able to progress, ending all discrimination? And you know, really achieving full right for lgbti qa+ people. Yeah, we've had a related sort of question from one of our listings. On that about that you need for a federal.
