No need to do a surgery until the person is say, 15, maybe Australia, 16 or definitely 18 when it's their legal adult and it's their call gives a sense of ownership. So, and if there is a need under, and this article says, and I quote in, in addition, in order to carry out any such medical intervention, not urgent for

With permission will be granted from the local magistrates Court following the grounding of opinion, by an interdisciplinary committee, which consists of experts in such matters. And that would certainly, we would hope be people of intersex, including people of intersex experience and certainly it does. And there's also prison sentences and monetary penalties if they're if these laws are violated. So, that's a very, very welcome move. I'm trying to form its chief executive Dean Lee has said quote, we have seen something of what members of lgbtq+ community experience every day as is hateful. Well, I don't really think we should just, you know, sort of caving to verbal threats. That's not I just something about that. That says that's not right. And, you know, there must be other ways to protect staff. I don't know if it's phone calls or something record, the calls, traced the call.

As I say, stop the calls, you know, sort of put lights on your website or some social media saying if you have to disagree, do it, politely without threatening

Of much better ways to go about it. And I think that no one, I don't say, I haven't heard any of the outspoken, political commentators, who are? I'll be often very opinionated about nothing, not naming any names, really, come along, and

You know, sort of, you know, sort of condemned the threats. I haven't heard of that. If they have, I'm happy to be corrected.
