But if you're out

Sing at a party and of course perhaps in a same-sex relationship with lots of other women. Oh, no, that's not acceptable. Least that's a possible Theory or the numbers they're off. So got me thinking about what sort of other double standards are there. And here's where I'll give a small content note. We've seen in the last week or so eight days. First, a front-page article in last weekend's weekend Australian. I suppose, I have to

Mention it to say where it was on a person who a trans person who to use the word, d, transitioned and G, lo and behold four days later at particular reporter in nine media, whose name, I won't even mention there's a front page article on the age. Now let's get something clear. First trans people always said, we need to be ourself to be happy healthy and Achieve. Our potential, really? Everyone needs that whether they're serious or trans black or white brown,

First Nations not First Nations and so if when you can safely be your authentic self and I underline the word safely that's a good thing and so I think that there needs to be a careful space for discussing issues of D transition. But where's the double standard in this debate? Why is it that the Murdoch media gives so much space to the one person who D Transitions? And

It looks to me, like there's some pretty glib pre-prepared down pat lines, but do they ever give space to the 99 out of 100 people who go down a trans path and a happy they did that. Do they talk about what I call not? So heavy regret, there is genuine regret in the case, of the people who decide to D transition, but I remember a situation many years ago where a person could not go.

Completely down their path because they were unfortunately site verbally will say threatened by a partner saying I'll divorce you and you know, that not in a kind way. Yes. If it doesn't work out, you divorce but you don't stop someone doing it. The person

may have had their emotional shortcomings, the trans person and maybe the partner as well, but that's not a reason. So there's what I call not so heavy regret, where people often go back to the gender presumed for them based on

On their sex assigned at Birth because of society or from a family or other pressures. And there's certainly been cases reported of that or perhaps because of stereo ironically stereotypes often put across by those who would have a go at us and say, and I'll come back to that double standard on that in a second. And they, perhaps they don't in big inverted, commas look like a woman enough or look like a man enough and this often perhaps of not considered non binary in terms of various parts of

Expression. It's interesting. One of the double standards that was leveled against trans women as if we look really feminine and look like what is more? A lot of society expects of a woman that we're deceivers but if we look too masculine we're told we're caricature. So which one is it? So there's a double standard. So I just got to thinking about lots of double standards on debates. Now, one of them that came to mind, which I put in the promotion for today's program, is this silly idea that minorities have to agree on every Dot

Omron. If we don't were all disunited and no one will listen to us. Well, if we're talking in this case, the minority of trans will assist people don't agree on everything and if we're talking lgbtiq a plus not lgbtiq. I+, don't agree on everything but you don't hear people say well we're not going to listen to non lgbtiq 0 plus people and I think that these things need to get called out in the case of D transitioning. The other thing I'd also want to add is that often we hear?

If there is an alleged, I want to be very careful here, ledged error of judgment on the part of the health. Professional who saw the trans person this lead suddenly to a debate that we should shut down all trans processes and Clinics and whatever else. Well unfortunately sometimes gays and lesbians do behave badly as do trans as Dubai is doing to sex as do humans generally. So the thing is covering it up, means it never gets solved. It doesn't get on the policy agenda, and we don't have a win-win solution and also it implies that the needs of gays and lesbians are more important than by which isn't equal. So, we need to unpack these myths. So I'm asking for your assistance.
