It does seem a very limited range of promotion and some people. So I will that get everyone else. You know, won't what it does is if you don't see yourself represented, you feel isolated and

disconnected white. This is not my community and I'll come to the positive, flip side of that, before we get to the end of the show. And Daniel says here, quote his words, I describe Queer as coalitional politics among sexes in among sex and gender undesirables.

Of the recognition that we're all getting F.K, I'd buy the right. It's not an essentialist identity but a practice of community across differences in sexuality, gender identity. And identity, disability, embodiment sex, work, drug users Etc. My problem with pride is the way it strips out all the politics. We are fighting as queers in to bring into public conversation at papers, over them, with its faith in the discourse and legal process of Human Rights. And it's confident expectation that social acceptance of sex and gender diversity is in.

Inevitable. In the end is a liberal centrism in a nutshell and it frowns on the queer critique of the right prior to end up. After the really ugly battles, have been won and declared itself, the Victor thanking liberal Centrist and respectability politics. And then Daniel goes on to say, in this is where I just say subjectively, I agree with this. I fear an opportunity is missed. I wish for something like the two-day, queer thinking Festival that may have Marsden and Nikki Stevens organized, in 2018 and 19. Not a

Prince with a 10 minute slot for every visiting LGBT luminary working in the human, UN Human Rights system. Rather a celebration of kriya critique that provokes its participants to consider how we can live in protest in community with each other. Celebrating our differences in effective opposition to the right and then says second and Daniel Tim far as I know is identifies a cisgender second this would have to be part of such event. We need to be talking about how we protect trans communities from Attack it.

Feels bizarre to me to be celebrating Pride which sees progress on LGBT rights is inevitable at a time when events in Australia the US and UK tell us every single thing we can be achieved can be undone in a matter of years and simply because our putative liberal allies the guardian, the New York Times can't get their head around. The idea that trans people are just trying to live their lives. Yep, you got it. I'll put a link to this blog post from Daniel into the podcast. You want. It goes up. I think this is just what we need to say. And look, I can't feel World, Pride.

The I've said this before. I will say it again. Mardi. Gras is the parent of will Pride Mardi. Gras has an abysmal history of biphobic vilification content. Note biphobia that said that, if you put buyer on your membership form for Mardi Gras, in the early days you were called before a panel and asked where you going to sabotage Mardi Gras. And yet, you know, you know as a rainbow Community as a whole, we ask for apologies from parliament's for past convictions. We ask for apologies from police forces for brutality in over the

Last few weeks the Queensland Force has done that. We got apology from the Victorian, police force for the tasting nightclub rate in 2014 yet. We can't apologize to each other. We cannot get Mardi Gras to say by people, we treated you appalling lie. Well, Mardi Gras. This will be at your own Peril because frankly, you know, buys the biggest by plus regardless of particular, labels is the biggest sexuality under the rainbow. It's only going to get bigger, you will lose.

Market. If you can't even see that logic where you at, so now that's the bottom line. And at that sell gold said so, and I just feel that this is really, really disappointing that Mardi. Gras cannot do this and I can't go there until that happens and I won't go to World Pride. What everyone does is their choice. You know, we can agree to disagree, but I have a right to express my feelings and I just cannot see how this this can keep

Going on and welcome, everyone's thoughts on this, if they're expressed nicely, but we have, you know, we just did not seem to be holding space well enough in how we do these sorts of things. So there's my soapbox for the day, wouldn't it be a nice dream if we could find balance and all that sort of thing? Well, let's well, they're not a quiz on this song. Kind of

Any one thing on policy in now, nearly nine months since labor was elected, and that was the social security minister talking about lgbtiq A+ Family Violence, which is something we need to talk about and make sure that services are inclusive and don't have a heteronormative cisnormative assumptions.

But there's been a few reactive things thanks to advocacy by people. When the industrial relations law was updated last year. On lots of things. It finally was updated to include gender identity and the current definition of intersex status, and there was a commitment given to aren't update. Intersex status to variation of sex characteristics in both industrial relations, and the federal sex Discrimination Act.

But that's not really a comprehensive strategy or policy. It also should be noted, there is no lgbtiq, A+ employee at the Australian Human Rights Commission. No funding for such a position, and there's no commissioner. It's pretty thin on the ground. And so, I'm a great believer balance. Again, two words for today, connectedness and balance symbolism is great. You need to communicate. I'm a great believer in. This is something I would say.

The education. You've got to do the work to be diverse and then communicate you're doing it but one without the other isn't going to work. It's the old. Oh, we put a rainbow sticker on the door. See where inclusive and Nia will Marching In Mardi? Gras elbow is simply not enough and it highlights some of the issues that I think exists, in my opinion with a very sort of top of town, Sid approach from Sydney, which is not about Sydney. It's about how that city as the particular City it is is

Not keeping up with current issues last year that are certain large Sydney, based organization advertised a conference and said we want to talk about. I almost feel content note on this. The original advertising said emerging issues like by non-binary and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and queer emerging. Goodness Me are Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, queer straight or otherwise have been here for tens of thousands of years.

So, as one Scenic said, emerging pink dollars, perhaps, so yeah, we've got that issue. I do get along to one Forum which highlighted some research on what Ace people are experiencing in medical systems and the denialism.

Lack of Ace awareness, you know, but also some good stories as well. Many many people spoke Todd Fernando Rodney Chrome row, Allen previous commission. One of the few people who only had to change half their business card when they change jobs, but I think speech of the day and I'll go and I'll put a link to this one in as well. Went to Jack tomlin's and how we engage with people, which is this is where I like, Daniel readers article that I just quoted. It's all very well.

I think we've got a fair idea in Rainbow communities at least now of the wish list, even if people don't understand it and thoughts of allies have to that's the what. But it's the how interestingly week ago, I got given him a small book on leadership, which talks about how we sometimes get external externally focused on results in a business that could be achieving a sales Target. But he's leadership about internally how we operate what our values are, and yeah,

Yeah, I think that we need to do more of that. Yours truly gave a talk on daily respect within rainbow communities, which seemed to flow in a way from Jac Tomlins talk. I'm will hopefully get Jac Tomlins on out of the pan at some point to talk about her or and I'll see if I can get. I'll have a know, I have an audio of my thingummy. You do that my talk, lots of other great talks.

Alasdair Laurie on a similar theme homo truths about advocacy and concerns that you know, we're not engaging enough people in the right ways and to do the work. What else did? I see one wonderful session, which was about now, the exact title was hidden conditions, I'll use the word hidden aspects of ourselves hidden intersectionalities. So this could include mental health neuro Divergence, chronic illness to name.

But a few and this is something that I think, I don't know, I personally felt the most affirmed in those areas of my life. I have three hidden disabilities. I have experienced cyclothymia. Got it reasonably well, managed, but it's always there being a form of depression that's, or mental health situation. That's similar to bipolar 1 & 2. I have one leg slightly shorter than the other. I have one eye weaker than the other. They are hidden disabilities. People might not think about,

I'm recently when I had to get a health assessment someone said I'd you walk a lot like I said well I swim why don't you walk? I mean do I feel like I have to explain the whole thing that I have one leg slightly shorter than the others. It's not as mentally relaxing, blah blah blah but it's a hidden sense disability. Does it affect my life alone? It has it's affecting it less because going to learn to manage it. But people didn't listen. So it's a very affirming session on the fun side, the always in a minimum inimitable fraud.
