Someone want to and just introduce themselves first.

Hi, my name is Joyce iucd pronounce. And yes, I'm Singaporean. But I am not in Singapore right now. I am in fact in the US and I'll be going from place to place talking about what talking about what's going on in Singapore, which is basically the attempt by the Christian far right to take over at the Singapore state. So I'll be going from so I will be going on what you

Call the world tour. So yeah, hi. Thank you so much for joining us Joyce particularly. If the time zone is could be very different amongst many many other things and do other two guests want to time wanted to dive in and say hello as well.

Yes, I'm Carrie your I usually open house and I'm also in Singapore right now. And basically I just want to preface this by saying that a lot of what's going to happen and has been happening in Singapore will affect the rest of the region were afraid of us the world as well. So there's not even a local issue. This is very much an international issue. That's what that is my introduction very very much. So, yeah and to our third.

Welcome.

Hello, I'm Harvey. I use she/her pronouns and I just my introduction is essentially that in the past one vear. I've been.

Fixed up and internationally maligned

Well, so yeah, look at that sort of gets right into the gist of the very heart of these matters in terms of that. I might just come back to you Harvey, but I'll get perhaps if a bit more detail on what is happening with this rise of Cristo fascism in Singapore and how it's affecting what we in so-called Australia would call lgbtiq i+ communities in particular.

That might be a place. I think just to start to give us the and our listeners the overview of what's Happening.

And it just added to point if anyone wants to sort of take that away. Yeah.

How's the foot so the long story short? Is that for the past year and a half now? We have been battling against single file right actor who goes by the name of mercury, Jamie Alice. I mean, they like is not like it's not accurate to say that, you know, they are Christian far right but there but in order to get a we get out of

People from their own crimes. They funded the Christian far right for help, and they said, you know, I'm an X transpose a time at the transition of and you have a cabal of lgbtq folks are trying to accuse me of things. I did not do as retaliation for detransitioning. So that's the so that's the kind of the gist of it. I think Caroline Carey would be able to have more input on this. Yeah, please Carrie

Give him a choice but introduction. Well, I guess long and short is that Singapore has got the Christianity has got a long history in Singapore by hasn't always been far. Right and he has always been fundamentalist. But sometime after the late 1980s after the Singapore internal security department carried out this thing cooperation spectrum and detained close to both more than 15 Catholic Social activist in Singapore accusing him of a Marxist conspiracy ever since then a lot of our Villages politics has shifted drastically. It was the far right especially when it comes to Kristen.

Listen Singapore. And so that is much more recent development. But we're looking at 36 years of history in terms of the Singapore political landscape. And why is this relevant here right now? And what does what does this affect the rest of the world right now as well and not just queer and trans singaporeans and quenchers prolong the world but ordinary people everywhere in different parts of the world as well is because essentially it is National Security and political economy in any society are intrinsically intertwined. You can't separate the dough from each other and in fact economists have a done for it recorded a

Enforcers buffer problem every society is going to face a trade-off in that but the question is it's inevitable for any society to mess that up at some point. How do you answer to the message? How do you respond to the massage? When you have people in society who asked inconvenient questions about his who bring these things to attention? How do you respond to that in general governments respond to a report? Even the sponsors either they shoes to fix the problems at the core of it or they choose to fix up the people who raised this problems and bring these problems to public attention because they're inconvenient.

And the Crux of this whole Mercury situation and it's focused invite and not just Christian Fire by multiple other far-right groups and afters in Singapore the Crux of this situation is that the per system response ever since then has been to fix up the people bringing these attention these problems to attention rather than to fix the bones themselves. And that is how we have gotten to the stage today. And when it comes to Singapore Singapore has three very unique characteristics. I think a lot of people have many different opinions about Singapore, but we're not looking at opinion today. We're looking at the facts about Singapore the Undisputed facts of asking about that we are

Very small, we have a small interior with a very high population density living in this smaller than a lanyard and compared to most other societies that are a lot larger a lot sponsor. We are much more governable Society what that also means is that whatever happens to sing about that reverberates around rest of the world as well. Right? And so any political changes that happen to sing about especially given the regional landscape, especially given the presence of other religious far-right groups in the region as well the Muslim for the Buddhist for the Hindu for it. Whatever happens in Singapore Kristen fight Takeover in Singapore will

Impact the rest of the region will impact the rest of the world. This has consequences for great power rivalry as well. So what happens in about could very much dot dot dot WWII put it this way, right? So that is basically the Crux of what was happening right now and for the past year and a half is has been seven sixteen Seventeen months or so already essentially you've got this person. Kaomoji me a list which joins us talked about Coon essentially in any other Society, especially one like Singapore who claims to emphasize the importance of stability of Law and Order and stuff you wouldn't

Imagine that the first response would be let's take a customs about this. Let's stop the harassment. Let's stop the tracks. Let's stop the threats to Public Safety to public order to the not and not and not just to trans people and poor people but Ordinary People because Mercury is victims included people as young as five to as well as 88. So Makuta gets people of all demographics of all Races and religions of all genders and sexualities of all kinds of basically all segments of the population. That should be any for any finally Society for

The government that's the first thing you want to come in. You're not you want to take it a step and say we'll take this seriously. This did not happen in Singapore because we are so used as a society to not wanting to publicly admit that we have these serious problems to run to keep up certain image that we are able to keep everything in order and that we don't in fact have these problems that impulse is automatically to fix up the people who bring this up that engine and basically characterizes as the trajectory the state rather than confront the fact that you have a real tractor amongst your mixed with you.

I don't able to deal with thank you for that. I think that really puts the picture in perspective and sort of does that sort of incredibly? Well, I think that it's also a good lead-in to a question. We want to discuss. I mean, these are my words but there's discussion not and I'll say there is discussion about exactly you've touched on the government the sort of

Um governing the way Singapore government and sort of controlled keep things in order. But is there any sort of official opposition or opposition parties who are trying to oppose this apart along with people like yourself or is that sort of being silenced? What is the perhaps tell us in your own words what the story? Is there anyone who wants to chip in?

Well, I mean, I would respond to that by saying two things. The first is that I come to this call and I come to any conversation about this matter not as an activist. Although I do have a history as a community organizer because when you live on the margins, you have to organize to survive, but I come to this call as a direct survival as a direct victim was facing a lot of this far right actually measurements and bodies attacks for the past 17 months. I don't have the time to be an activist when it comes to these matters. This is the matter of daily survival. This is a matter of life and death and so a lot of what I say here and now we get to the matter of other political parties in Singapore.

Neither the ruling party not opposition parties and Singapore particularly appraised of the full State of Affairs in this matter precisely because it has not been brought to public attention and in Singapore, we essentially have what's a power vacuum right now right where by nobody is really prepared to govern this Society because there is so much going on and people look at it and it's just so overwhelming and essentially nobody dares to confront the full extent of things. So you have a lot of parties to Singapore who essentially are proceeding business as usual not necessarily.

Because they don't want to take a position about it, but because they don't know even what affections of of the extent of things and I would say that this becomes a true shock when it comes to the attention of

most singaporeans and that is exactly why the people who are in charge of trying to this situation in order do not dare go let it blow up and are trying to delete like persistently and sure that this does not come to public attention that is what is actually currently going on and I'll say that on the ground you do have people who are increasingly finding out about the fact that these things are happening.

And this is obviously a concern in Singapore because Singapore has prided ourselves on being stuff like anti-corruption being stuff. Like one of the safest countries in the world are making stuff that you can go on the streets and nobody's going to kidnap you. Nobody's gonna kill you. Remember the warm you that is General perception that people have in Singapore including by Singapore's including internationally what happens when that comes under attack what happens when you have an anniversary that can exploit police procedure to obtain someone's address what happened when you kind of adversary who can go to and send someone into a hospital walk to model.

People write you have these things happening and people hear about it and inevitably after a while people will be like, what is the government doing about it? But this is ultimately not a method that can only be left to the government essentially because you need communities who are able to be resilient who are able to basically be vigilant in the face of these far-right tracks because fire trucks have been single for a long time. It's a matter of whether we are able to respond to them because we to be completely realistic Singapore's given our positionality given the fact that we are essentially a

Center of a region that is very much at the intersection of a lot of global passageways a lot of global conflicts for and and the attention of a lot of global superpower rivalry as well. USS eyes on the region China has eyes on the region India has her sights on the region. You are definitely going to have a lot of Confluence of all of our actions actors that want to set their sights on Save and I'll just write it all kinds of adversity that want to set their sights on simple. This is inevitable. The question is do the people up there have the ability to confront these things. Have we built

Eat up collectively not just at the government advisor Society have we built up the necessary capabilities in our communities to confront? Our action is amazing apple, or is it a lot of basically trying to pretend Obama's not as bad as it actually is so I think that's actually where we are right now as a stance and that's why you have this whole impulse when it comes to fixing people rather than fixing problems and what and this is actually this actually ties back to world twenty20 one protests happened in Singapore when it comes to trans rights in Singapore, which was got fix schools not students.

I think if we extrapolate that a bit larger, but we essentially have is we need to essentially call for Singapore to fix problems. Not people in the same vein of Faith schools, not students and this actually ties in in fact with the fact that a lot of the National Security interventions that has happened have been very much focused on trying to ensure that certain contentious matters and our political economy. Do not get service for fear that if the truth about them gets brought like the full extent the bottom guesswork like it will destabilize our thing.

Cyber, security and economy because other people are exploited one example, which I think has been brought up has to do with essentially I will Retirement adequacy Systems in Singapore when it comes to our essentially. What was our compulsory saving system in Singapore for the cpf right now leave George to talk more about that. Actually. Yeah, please please go ahead choice. So so yes, so I wish to talk about operation Providence and the central Provident Fund in Singapore.

Okay, I asked Abby has already said the central Provident fund or the cpf is a mandatory retirement savings scheme. So any so the end of the month your employer has to your employer has the basically when they pay you they have to take 20 percent of your salary and put that their cpf the promise is that when you reach 55 you can start withdrawing.

You can start withdrawing the funds and cpf provide that you've reached a minimum. Sum. So yeah to put it this way and I do I will hand it also Harvey really shortly. So the last one is that so yeah, like two weeks ago. I staged a protest here in Seattle regarding the situation Singapore.

Or and this and Well turns out a week before that Harvey as well as another friend but Acosta and beat up by cons what you know, and the cogs were told to send Harvey a message which essentially, you know tells her to keep her mouth shut about certain things but shut about what this is where we get to operation Providence.

And Harvey, I you know, I'm going to pass the mic to you. So maybe you want to explain what operation Providence is about. Please do having yeah.

And I would just ask Ed for our listeners rainbow door one eight hundred seven to nine three six seven and Q Life in Australia 1-800 1845 27. If you do need to talk about anything that is of concern to you. I'm happy yet. Tell us more about what Joyce has just started talk discussing.

They had some Dropout heavily.

No, just breathe. Okay, because Harvey has mentioned a bit about this but basically a very brief summary of this operation as essentially that in the leaders of the G20 2011 general elections, which has to be seen in Singapore in the context of the aftermath of the global financial crisis in 2008, which has wiped out many millions of people's retirement savings bonds around the world. Not just example, of course, right as well as the after-effects of essentially a long decade in the two thousands of basically Singapore. I'm critically

Raising the reagan-thatcher doctrine only book on economic policy deregulation of Finance. Those are the exact same things that led to the 2008 Global financial crisis and which has definitely hit Singapore as well. But Singapore The Narrative we tell ourselves is essentially that the Asian financial crisis of 1997 and 1998 had left us with relatively unscathed. Right? So Singapore walked away from that deciding we have the confidence now less deregulate the financial sector in Singapore standing upon the global financial sector into a room of Global Financial Centre even

Oh that comes at the expense of working class in our bones, even though that comes at the expense of the stability of our economy, even though they're essentially exposes us to certain kinds of songs that we are unable to do freaking so the 10:40 generation came as a shock to Singapore's government came as a shock to Singapore's ruling party because they lost one group one group representative constituency which in in any other countries that result because the landslide Victory 60% vote so big a landslide victory in any other country, but in Singapore Devil's Constitution put them and then after an in the lead-up to that in the next few years, we need 12

Not in 2014. You've got multiple political observers. It got multiple notable opposition politicians to sing opposed to other reason questions about the cpf savings of singaporeans. And basically how much of that is actually left. What is this? What is this? What are these things been used on and I think that's very hard to find answers about them because while data is sometimes available, you're never going to be able to find a full data on it partly because of security reasons and confidentiality reasons, but the other part of it is because there is a lot of I mean as we know from the globe,

Financial crisis a lot of how financial management is done is such that certain things are disposed in a certain manner. So as to present a certain picture of things and in Singapore, especially I think the the impulse has been to present a picture that our economy is very much doing fine fundamental in the in terms of the fundamentals, right? So then we get to operation problems, which is how does the state and in particular the internal security department respond when people are asking questions that cut too close to the heart of something that is

Duncan uncomfortable inconvenience

My past is to Joyce and then after that laughing after a short outline of their we can talk about our costing. Yeah perfect choice. So yes to keep like the keeper a long story short. The government felt that can of got has stopped at the tread a bit too close for comfort.

This is cpf matters considered quite sensitive for the Singapore government, right? Yeah, so they start figuring out how you know, they could discredit kind of Dorado.

And this is where we get to Harvey we're so at the time Harvey was online friends with can of journals son, right and because and because of because of Harvey so

Familial connections on her estranged father's site. There was a there was also another indirect connection to an associate of Canada right now.

So this is I won't go to the like the specifics of that but long story short the internal security department realize that hey, if we if you get Harvey to testify against can of Geronimo on you know on our behalf we could discredit we could describe it the guy and that's why they did what they proceeded to do in 2013 was too.

Framing Harvey for bomb hoax she did not commit so that when she is arrested and interrogator the internal security department condense that in and see you know, you do this for us.

Are we refuse to given previous life experiences with the police she refused to and again this since then in 2014 and in 2015, she has been accused of further bomb hoax as you know, she was reminded to The Institute of Mental Health or both in 2013. And then in 2014 and in the 2014 remand to The Institute of Mental Health

She was sweet and since then Javi has not how he has not seen Justice for their like in 2016 when Harvey saw the police report about that rate. The police basically said they were not going to take any further action which for which Harvey had to then file a civil suit against the National Health Care Group the parent organization.

One of the incident mental health which are eventually because Harvey was not able to get a lawyer the case was dismissed.

I like to sleep in my right so to speak and just for our listeners again, 1-800 1845 to seven one eight hundred seven to nine three six seven numbers to call in Australia if anything is distressing in that content. Yeah funny. You want to play something. What's a clarification sorry?

Do that would be a persistence to you in your sort of striving against all these matters. How can we be supportive in terms of what we do and what we don't do that would be of help.

Go ahead. Go ahead. I think that would definitely be a number two other kinds of support will include of course getting the word out about the matter as well as getting people to write.

Into Jello to to develop and embassies to basically ask the Singapore government what was going on about this take action about this and basically getting more people to take so take whatever kind of kinds of action that we're doing this to our attention and that will ensure that people around the world showing that this is not something that they will stand forever in Singapore because as a method as interconnected for all of us because whatever happens is they have over fight them as well. Great. Thank you for that. Hairy hot. Yeah, and I would like and so

So look at what think that mean not have been like where the pieces are do not exactly join together yet is how does this how does the cpf matter tie into the whole how does it tie into the Mercury and a question for right case? Well, long story short. The ISD themselves is okay before we even get to that Harvey and Mercury met in 2019 where Mercury the times.

Do you know that she was a trans woman that got kicked out of our family home because her family is transphobic. That's true. And and yeah, like we were going to the specific details that were like that working tensions between both Mercury and Harvey and that became known such that the internal security department realize that he Mercury could that like could be a very good

Good well fixer the deal with Harvey and you know because now Harvey knows about the whole Providence thing, right? So yeah, my understanding at least is that my understanding at least is that basically they are.

They basically sent messages to Mercury's fans like parents traveling to firebomb the family home. So that mercury as far as to Rena whole system. Look, he's older sister. I think would be interrogated by the police and then the internal security department can step in and say, you know, yeah, can we go on is specifically what that involved was that they were the internal security.

Purported to have received an anonymous tip of that Mercury's sister. Joanna was going to flood was going to plot a terror attack on the key project shop in Singapore out of supposedly transphobic extremists like notice and use that as basically a pretext to basically bring Mercury even in for questioning and during that process ask Mercury to carry out certain favors for them and basically assist them in much longer term weeks and that's it. Actually that time some of these

Subsequently repeatedly mentioning that they have an ISD handle example.

So, yeah, certainly this whole situation sounds like now on so many levels of massive will say massive abusers and misuse of power that needs to be made about you know communicated about as you all have said and very, excuse me, very just horrifying circumstances personally and just sort of every information of how horrible those

In that sense of how horrible these experiences are and now just Commendation to all of you for being willing to speak out about these issues in what a very intimidating circumstances. It's um, you know, just an absolutely incredible situation and that you're doing so from everywhere to do this now. It's it's just a just the whole complication.

Told there's so many angles to this. So it seems just seems absolutely almost Beyond measured probably to a lot of people and daughter some of our list as yeah.

Is there anything else you wanted to add about this whole situation before we wrap it up at this point? I think we've got the got the gist of it. I will sort of you know, I've you've got your website in this safety for Singapore.com is where we people can find out more detail about many of these things. Now. Is there anything else that each of you would like to add to close our conversation?

So in the mean time passed it on the character of wrap up the main thing. I want to say given my experience organizing elsewhere. Meaning, you know in the west is the the like I've seen a lot of people even in the west to say that, you know, there's things like if things go south that, you know, they're going to move

Like, you know they want they're going to move to some other country. They could move to Canada. I got moved to Europe but you know New Zealand something right and on that front, I like if you look at what's going on in New Zealand more, you know, in the reason the reason few weeks. They have like their government has completely flipped, you know to being a very conservative.

Government, you know and that's and that's are not seeing a whole lot there. Right? So what I want to see is that but you know, no matter what where you go, you have to fight back you haven't stand up for these sorts of things because their Arsenal against these sorts of things because you know, if you don't do that, they'll be no safe haven for any one of us the

Yeah, there's no such a safe haven for anyone of us. There may be temporary reprieve you can escape fast as Dominic, you know, or of whichever far right or tread for a short while but if you don't but if you don't speak up they eventually get you that's on the sea and also you've mentioned the safety for Singapore site. I do wish to clarify that.

That the sun is not run by any one of us. Thus the site run by a group of other organizers and activists were aware of the situation. So yeah, Carrie, do you have anything to say to wrap this up? Yes. I I wanted to actually give a shout out to the people who the international Commerce of ours who have been supporting us in terms of putting all of this content because you know, we are a lot of us. Like I said earlier we are not acting this we are swamped to the Core.

Like to survive day today in this situation, we are not coming to this from the perspective of activist in Singapore. Even if we have our own - experience doing activist work in Singapore. A lot of what we are doing here is basically this is a live or die matter. And so what I want to wrap this up by saying is basically you've got certain departments in Singapore. You've got certain agencies are not all agencies Isabel like this no state in the world is a monolith right now, of course no institution. No government. No Society in the world as a model if but you have certain agencies in Singapore.

Or who have been operating under the premise that they can fix people what an Ethics problems they can get anyone to sell out against the interest of your Commerce against the ensure that your fellow citizens against the interest of their fellow people. That is the most detrimental thing the single most detrimental thing to Singapore's National Security and no Department that claims to be an internal security department can be encouraging fellows in opposed to sell each other out. So the one last message, I want to leave all of us basically internationally and Australia everywhere else want to whoever's listening.

We stand with each other. We do not sell each other out and anyone who tries to sell each other out obviously that goes against the interest of Singapore of the people of Singapore and of the people of the world because this is a matter that I reiterate. This is not a Singaporean letter. This is a global matter. This is a matter that has consequences for people everywhere in the world because of operation high tide and the remaining fix-ups succeed in Singapore Singapore taken by over by any vital adversary. There will be no safe country that we know saying Society left in the world.

Where you go for anyone of any demographic, especially the most marginalized especially the most precarious. So the message I want to leave for everyone essentially. Basically is that

It's basically stand with us then each other and let's make sure we do not repeat the same thing and to the people who have been essentially using this intimidation tactics to try to frame people up to try to fix the clock to try to silence people from bringing these these methods to attention. I will quote the words. I will order was a former Singaporean prime minister continued this and we will by every means at our disposal teach you and get the people of Singapore to teach you a lesson. You won't forget and we are prepared to stop.

All over again. Ah stop it. That is my message. And I think anyone in the world stand with us, we stand together. We will not stand for this kind of selling each other out will not stand for this kind of fixing each other. Thank you very much. Cool Harvey anything from you from you.

I would say.

I hope that

I hope that more people of the world. Do you stand with us and

I hope that you survive.

And everyone else who may be fixed up by the Singapore state or by Christian professors anywhere else also survived.

Thank you so much Harvey, Joyce carry and Harvey. Thank you so much for your time. Yes. I'm sending every strength to you in your what you are striving to do.
