Yeah, which is an interesting thought because we are we exposing more 90% of sport is you know, he's Outdoors, you know, there's obviously Indoor Cricket and I know indoor rock climbing come to mind and by now I suppose.

Maybe not 90% but a large chunk and we do associate it with it. And then of course sadly we do have homophobia biphobia and transphobia into phobia in sport queer phobia saddest with is to consider that so it's an it's in one sense. It's a natural enough reaction, but it's just hasn't been one that's turned up which I went what hasn't been an issue that's turned up, which is really cool. Yeah. Yeah. I mean, I think perhaps part of it. We've kind of talked about it before we don't have very much about team sports at all. And I think part of the issue.

Has just started difficult for people to record pieces in that kind of situation. Where as if your sport is a solo sport like kayaking can be for example, it's easy enough for you to take your phone out and record a piece while you're out kayaking a bit harder to do it while you're playing basketball. That's a yes, you know, that's what do they call it the the like they have in the take 20s where they have the other lot the commentary from players on.

Fields here basketball running up and down the court. Yes. I'm you just go all of that sounded just like that sounds a bit like something else which I'm not going to go. I'm going to because it's 25 minutes after midday, but it's you know, it's great that there's this variety and it's great that there's the interest and it's great that you're filling the niche that must be a that's got to feel really cool. Yeah. I mean, it is really cool. And I think you know, like I said we

Weren't sure if people were going to be interested in it, but I think there is a maybe a specific kind of person who is interested. And because it's their Niche there isn't really anything else out there that like it that's filling that Niche. So when people find out they get very enthusiastic about it, which is really nicely and you may I just get us going to something that did come to mind you

mentioned earlier that you know, this wasn't just for so-called Australia. It's for anywhere near on.

Earth who has an internet connection or something and can get the or some sort of means of communication to find out about it all what how many different countries. Do you have an idea of how many different nations and places and you know, what are some of the ones that really stand out that where people have submitted sound sent things from? Yeah. I mean, that's a good question. We obviously being English speakers and a French speaker Alice also speak Spanish, but most of the pieces that we get are from the jar.

Swept projects goes into greater history on this and huge content note here that a particular person murdered 49 women. Most of them sex workers said he chose quote marks prostitute as his victims because quote because they were easy to pick up without being noticed a new that would review but not be reported missing right away might never be reported missing which is a very sad indictment and I think that this

Issue is therefore of great relevance to queer and agile programming about gender because this seems to have a very strong link to misogyny ISM and patriarchy and internalised Prejudice that people might have about gender and its really sad that that happened. So it's very important that we note this day and I note on the same New South Wales site that I just mentioned that if your

Medium term diary dates there's three dates next year 3rd of March is international sex workers rights day. Second of June is international sex workers day and 14th of September. Next year is sex worker Pride. So really important that we celebrate this and I'll be getting myself organized and talking to people from organizations that are run by sex workers.
