Out of the pan this isn't it? Somehow it is. Well, well remedy that at long last that's a good thing. I'm so good to have you here to talk about your Melbourne International Comedy Festival show which hits the boards as the these Showbiz people say from April 10th functional bottom. What? What do I where do I begin Where Do We Begin? I guess well the show sort of started when I landed in ICU for days before May 31

Fourth was my 34th birthday was that long ago now and since then I've just been going through hell with my health my stomach and my bowels ruptured overnight completely out of the blue and I didn't have a functional bottom for the last year. I was living with a stoma and colostomy bag up until four days before last Christmas. So that's kind of where the show starts and then it just keeps getting deeper and deeper and deeper after that point. Yeah. Well deep deeper and deeper. There's

A million bad pun, but I'm right going to go there. Yeah sort of and I think we will I will give just as a general note here our content, you know our numbers for Q Life which includes

switchboard in and in Victoria and Tasmania on 1 800 1845 27 around this big island and surrounding smaller ones rainbow door one eight hundred seven, two nine three, six seven SMS rainbow door zero four eight zero zero one seven.

46 because you've you've said, you know, look at that's in all serious. That's obviously not a good thing to have happen and then you're saying it's gone. Well down so long to quote the title of the sting track. Yeah pretty much but you know comedy is such a great remedy to dark times and I think we'll talk a little bit more about it. But I think that you know, medical emergencies can happen and do happen to all of us and I think that that's really it's kind of something that I think a lot of people can relate to

Yeah, absolutely. Well, that's the thing. I mean we've all got bodies and we can do our best exercise diet and other things to look after them, but it's all things that we might not know about no matter how much we try our best and then they come out of the proverbial left field. So, I mean there would have been a suppose a psychological shock factor in a sense as well. Yeah huge. I mean, I I presented to the emergency room with really bad stomach pains and then it was basically we were waiting there and trees.

Straight hours and if they hadn't operated then in there I wouldn't be here with you on radio right now. I was literally about three or four hours away from from Death. So yeah, it's a lot. It's a lot to take in. I guess I'm proud of myself in the way that I've been able to handle the situation but in saying that I'm quite fortunate to have really strong friendship groups and community and chosen family around me. So

I will look to them. I'll just say yes. Totally we need those and here here and firmed from this side of the radio studio desk. Yeah, I'm going to thank the by neurodivergent communities for their support in the last four years is I I have to I think I'd better say that and then get back to interviewing you because your story functional bottom is your Melbourne International Comedy Festival debut, and it says in your media release, it's a

Yujin of Storytelling contemporary performance art filth provocation and tears probably yeah Darkly humorous exploration in the year of the life of Jesse. Ryan self-proclaimed artists journalists sex worker and hot flipping mess. Yeah, that's about it. I could say what it actually says, but because it's noon I'll be polite you will anyway, but I mean there's a lot just in that one paragraph, you know one year and that's that's sort of where it started.

Arted I mean, I'm almost you know, you discussed some of the themes here, you know, what you know sort of what are some of the other things that could possibly happen after a start to the year and then it got worse. Yeah. So, um, I work in media. I've been a journalist for a while a couple of other things happened last year firstly. I got the attention of a lot of the National Socialist Network so that the Nazi group we had a home invasion. I've been targeted online and

As I said to you just before you know, really just laughing at these dude, bro is because that's so we can do in the end of the day. I think we can fight a lot of that kind of fascism with with humor, you know and bringing people together also my sugar daddy of like 10 or 15 years died of cancer last year. So, I don't know if we can talk about let's just leave that out of there at the moment, but he had a particular fetish which related quite heavily to having a colostomy bag. So

Those two kinds of things together were you know, when those kind of events happen side-byside like what what can you do but write a comedy show about it, you know. Yeah. Well, that's its that's it's what it's well it's probably you know, look, it's more it's more releasing and then you've got at least a tenth I could say would driest of humor tongue wedged firmly in cheek coming out the side of you if you write about it, which is therapeutic, but then it's better than saying paying a psychiatrist \$500 an hour.

And just sitting on a couch. Yeah. Anyway, I tried to time people and who has \$500 these days with the cost of living right? Hey completely. Yeah, and if you do well you can be a sugar parent to me. Thank you very much. Yeah, so I guess yeah, I mean it's been been one hell of a year, but I'm just really excited to share this story and to bring Community together as well. Because the reason why I got the attention of these old right groups was because they

They covered the drag queen story time events around the country. Haha. Yeah, and then yeah one of those articles went viral and as I say in the show, if you think for some reason that a six-foot-tall bloke in a fairy princess costume reading the rainbow fish is somehow erotic that's between you and your search history good teaser then yeah, you've got it grunting. You know, I mean, I mean, I'll get you to put in your own words. I mean, I don't

Don't ask a question. Like what do you think about these stupid Ragtime story protests? I'll get you to put in your own words what you think about that because I think that will perhaps a it yet. Look, I mean, honestly we're going up in this kind of almost Golden Era of queer representation. I can only imagine how my life would have turned out differently if we had drag queen story time events as kids or as young adults. Look I just think that they're really angry that they can't look that fabulous to be fair ha ha

Ha ha. Absolutely. Yes a big shout out to all the drag performers out there who just Glam it up. Yeah. It's well, look it is on my bucket list to do full drag full drag outfit and make up somewhere sometime. You look fabulous Ellie. Well, that's right. I've got to get this done. It's just I've reasonable at makeup, but I've never done the full on thing will have to work well work on it because it just I just think it's look it's fine.

It's know it. Yes drag can of course make a statement. It can entertain but it's just all so bit of fun and it's there's a little kid that wants to play dress-ups in me. I think so. There's one in all of us. Yeah, so we need that and of course and of course in this day and age any gender can do any gender which is well, you know, it always should have been has been that way now it's becoming more so it's great to see people regardless of how assigned how identifying do any form of drag which is why we're using drag performer. Yeah.

Yeah, so great to see that change, you know. Yeah and you are an artiste. Let's just apart from your first exploration into stand-up comedy, you know sort of what sort of when you're not doing stand-up what sort of artiste 3 do you do so, I've been a dancer since I was 15. I did my first solo performance spec in Metro arts in Brisbane 20 years ago now, but I spend a lot of my time touring across Indonesia and Malaysia working with a lot of

A lot of artists from that kind of region from across southeast Asia, which is great. I do a lot of fire performance. So basically anything that I can't get away with in Australia because of oh&s I get it to do in Asia. So fire gasoline petrol all these kind of things. So it's a lot of fun. Well that gives me at 16 minutes at about 40 seconds into the show the chance to do the wrestling reference. You should be out. You should do one of these Deathmatch types whether we're it's the equivalent of hitting yourself hitting people over the head.

With fluorescent tubes, that would be fun. Oh my eyes are lighting up. There we go. We got it in if you're on the betting pool today, if you bet 16 minutes and 34 seconds, you win choke choke or a veggie meat alternative chalk or something. But yeah, I mean, I definitely it's amazing. I'm

sort of a bit. Wow, so all sorts of performance, but you know, there's that saying there's a saying I don't know how true this is that people in our

We'll say more Performing Arts. There's what is it singing dancing acting and people are usually better two out of three, you know yet you've so dance seemed like it was your first but now you do you sing as well. No Okay. So we've got your 23 it's sort of dancing and acting. Yeah. No, I'm tone-deaf. I'm not great at singing. I do it in the shower singing. Yeah with the shampoo bottle. Yeah. Absolutely. Absolutely. Yes. Yes.

Yeah, that sounds like a fair thing. No. Look. Well, you've got to keep sending us the details of all your performances because that's just amazing. But you know, you've going coming back to functional bottom which is at Club V are 14 Raglan Street North Melbourne and put on by Jesse Ryan 10th to 14th of April, you know sort of it took you've also got yeah, there's a lot of other things that happened in.

The you know, it's sort of you had these four things emergency operating room table removal of your there: yeah, they're being yours death of your sugar daddy and being a queer journalists in the area of neo-nazis. Yeah, just a light on you. Just let on you. Yep fantastic, you know, and I wouldn't I wouldn't have it any other way my only my only my only as I said just before off are my only what's the word I'm looking for great. My only regret last year was I never got to colostomy bag and not see in the face because that

Would have just would have made my year. Yeah, that would have been that's Poetic Justice. I think that would have happened but I'm quite amazing that the thing is there's two questions that come up about the process. How was it to start actually taking all this raw material this real-life experience this lived expertise and write it and turn it into a show. I mean, what was how did you go about doing that? And what was involved? How did it feel those sorts of things? Yeah, so we actually

Anna Piper Scott shout-out amazing my amazing director. We got into the studio broom and we pretty much set down for four days and we wrote the script from j-league a lady gay. Yeah, I think in about four days and at that time, I was reviewing for Arts Hub. So I was out every night reviewing Midsummer shows and then writing a 5,000 word script in about four days. But yeah first first go we really like the scripts hasn't been many too many.

It's to it so yeah, just getting in and getting it done which is I guess one of my Powers being a journalist and a writer as I can. Just I can turn out content like there's no tomorrow, but I guess talking about some of the things like yeah, it is a little bit uncomfortable. It is a little bit gross. I mean, there's nothing there's no other way to describe having a colostomy bag right apart from unfortunately quite uncomfortable. So but you know,

I had to make sure that I was like comfortable and safe enough within my own memories of what's happened. Yes before being able to go into to the studio let alone transferring that to a stage of a live audience in front of me because that safety is so important as a performer. Yeah, you got to hold that safe space for for your audience. Well, absolutely. You've got to be while say in a sense power might be a word that comes to mind. Otherwise if you're not and something goes to mark their new your audience can go sort of go amok in.

Also good way 100% Yeah, so you've got that there and I mean the thing is with Anna Piper Scott behind you. I mean like comedy. Well, we won't be gendered will say royalty royalty royalty oven on of a non-elite sense or something like that. Yeah. I mean, how was it like to work with Anna Piper Scott who I love I love Anna. I absolutely adore and I uh, I've been a huge fan of and and Piper's got four years now like every time I get to review shows its

Always anytime there's a festival around. I always make sure that I see what I was doing. So originally it was going to be directed by Fiona Scott Norman and shout out to the owner as well. But she was like, it's too aggressively queer for me to touch. So that's how Anna stepped in and it's just kind of worked perfectly together. I like trans non-binary people just doing it for ourselves, which is you know, how we have to do it most of the time but it's just also really great to have that representation, you know? Yeah, look there's a lot there's lots of good stuff.

Satellites and I honestly don't know if it can be said publicly how Fiona identifies in terms of gender and sexuality or whatever, but I think I agree with you there. Is that transcend? I think that's a great thing to have happen as we are next week, of course approaching trans day of visibility, which if I can digress for a second gives me a chance to mention the special 3 CR broadcast trans day of auditability on next Sunday. Yes, it's Easter Sunday. So if you're not off holidaying somewhere, in fact, I'll give you if you want to come in and listen in.

And hang out with the with the transcript from 3:48. Please do Jesse because you know, this is I think I think we're beginning to get this understanding the Allies that great but we know we can do it for yourself. And sometimes we just need that understanding so having someone who's beyond the basic binary is really good. Yeah, I look and his work is amazing and she's of course, you know really rising up there at the moment with this. I forgotten the name of the show and evening with JK and evening.

Jk. Yes. I couldn't remember the exact name. Thank you, which is you know, I've got to say bold stuff, but it's I think it's the only way to be in the end. Yeah the time for being silent and sitting on our hands. I think he's very much over like we've got to be silent. We got to agitate we've got to be aggressive in our need for Change and to dismantle systems at the moment and I think comedy is a really great vessel for doing that. You know. Yeah. Well comedy. Definitely use the other thing, of course the moment you're going to keep reminding our listeners about for a few more

Or weeks is the chance for Trans people to write into the Australian Human Rights Commission about the current hate campaigns and put our lived expertise in there. I've got to say of there's a tooth there's a 2500 word limit and I've got about 800 words of rough notes. Let alone actually haven't written anything so contain myself pruning and pruning and shooting over Easter. So to speak speaking on the child's experience as well like one

Yeah, we did some work in progress showings. Yes weeks ago and I mean I was rough because I haven't been on stage in about 18 months, but we've got some really beautiful feedback and part of the story and very much part of the story is how like trans non-binary gender non-conforming people always have bad experiences in medical health settings. Yes, this show goes there and it just rips the Band-Aid off, you know, it's kind of those experiences that

That we need more education and more conversation around. You know, we've all had bad experiences in medical settings. Yeah. Well look very very true. We've all had whether it's medical or physical medical or psychological or holistic or whatever, you know, it's and this is you know, this is where comedy and artistic performance can vary very much make that commentary as well as the will say in inverted commas more serious things such as the HRC inquiry. So we

Do we need every Everything mg to get this back on track had a couple of messages in wombat one of our rec awesome listeners. I beg my own pardon said The Comedy Festival seems to have so much lgbtiq i+ to offer this year. It's fantastic. I would agree with that. You know, we had paid and I've seen last week. We've got a couple more goo assets coming in current weeks or next week will be the teed off special which I will talk about a bit later on.

And also just got to give a shout out. We had an SMS you late in last week's show just listening for the first time finding it all interesting and I've got to find got to go back and look at this some Peter Garrett was on the Australian story this week Heroes and also congrats top tip on Penny Wong and her marriage Pollyanna. And Kaitlyn's are asked if you have time I'd be interested in your guest experience with others acceptance of the colostomy bag others. I've spoken about two other people said it can be very lacking in understanding. Yeah, that's definitely something so I had a really great example going through airport security at Melbourne Airport. Oh, they strip search detained me nearly didn't

Get on my flight. It's another thing why I'm doing this show is because they're like the thing is I was very open about having a colostomy bag. And what I found was I had four or five friends that I've ever have one where I've lived with one. So it's one of those things that we need to mystify. I guess. I've got a very open Social Circle as you can probably imagine, so I was very fortunate but just in my interactions with the outside world, it was very much. Okay, so I need to sit down and explain.

Then what this is to you? Yeah, you know it's not it's not as widely spoken about as it should be it's a medical device. There's nothing wrong with it. Yeah, you know, I think that I hope that answered the question just there no, look it does and it gets onto two things one is that we don't have enough understanding of medical say medical diversity of All Sorts whether it's physical and/or psychological

But don't I'll just say don't get me started on Airport security. I do. Yeah, I ended up writing a piece for crikey about my experience which was how I was able to turn that around but I was able to rain hell down on Melbourne Airport for a good couple of weeks after that. So yeah, you know and it's I will say they're like, I'm aware of my privilege and that I'm fortunate enough to be able to call people out and I can Advocate but I know that there's a lot of people out there which don't have those kind of avenues to go down so

Yeah. Yeah, I'm gonna come back to that one in a second. But yeah, look airport security for I mean for Trans people alone and let's just start with that one part of the intersection as just has been stuck for about 12 least will 12 years. I mean, I've had bad experiences in every Avenue I try whether it's through the relevant Union airport management. I will get back to you and not sitting by the the device waiting for a message I can tell you because nothing ever seems to happen or

Just don't get this. Yes, you can do security yet. Keep us safe, but you don't have to be a backside about it. Yeah. Yeah, I could go on for days about airport security as well. It's just like medical settings there just organizations and institutions that need to be challenged and dismantled, you know, yep. Well look definitely so and I mean that's the other thought that came to me intuitively. The second coffee has kicked in is you know, you do have the privilege of Journalism. I mean, I'm going to ask

If people think they have will say social justice type of stories for you. I mean, you know, is that something that you your contact herbal on? Yeah, absolutely. Just hit me up and socials or Google me. You'll find me but absolutely I'm always Keen to to get social justice issues across the line and get it out to to a broader audience. Yep. The Nazis already know who I am. So I'm not afraid to go any further. Sorry, very nice. Yeah look.

Look look definitely so I'll make sure I get the best thing contact for you to put in a little bit of that a what am I trying to say into a into this podcast link. Well, it's such a folded B all the port de Paul with all people who are against marriage equality law. So they're saying all we need a religious protection act every should protect minority religions that face discrimination. Absolutely Islam and Hindu and others, but you know for that for

This the elements of religion that have the power to say just because they can't do what they want is discrimination is just is well ridiculous and I have to say it so I don't know it's sort of like a bit like you sometimes you got to laugh because some of the stuff that's being put in the Murdoch media this week is so far-fetched that if you don't laugh you will cry. Yeah, it's barbaric. Yeah, you know, yeah, it's unfortunate that it's still going on and I don't think that we're going to see a resolution to this least in this term of government.

Or even the next perhaps and you are right. It was it was put in place to placate all the you know, all those people that had such a problem and thought the sky was going to fall in when you know same-sex marriage was finally reached. Yeah. Well, I just thought the skies up there the ceiling of the 3 CR Studio still there. It hasn't crashed through it. Yep. No, I'm still here. We're still here. So I think it's all right. And what is it there hasn't been fire and brimstone and so wise I have to imitate Davos.

Integrating that wailing and gnashing of teeth. What if you don't have teeth teeth will be provided. So yeah, it hasn't happened and it's like if you don't want to marry a couple other than what you're defining is male and female there is nothing in the in the marriage equality reforms of 2007 10. They write one paragraph We have never had any reason to use exemptions in relation to gender identity and sexual orientation and don't see that we will ever have to the end.

And so now look if schools want to choose to do that. Get my opinion both by now. Yeah, I know. It was a lower. I haven't been watching the news much this week. So just been too much going on. So this is true yet and I'm a little I'm like the butcher who backed into the meat mincer. I'm a little behind in my work. Someone's got to do those and they are it gags, but too seriously. And I know one of our guests I've had on the show many times Jack Brady would agree in there are others beginning to think the same about this approach of using comedy in a sort of joyous way to reclaim debates. I want to explain we've got a bit of time left about 5 to 8 minutes. I would like to explore this with you. Yeah.

But what comedy? What are the ways what to what would you know, I mean, let's go Blue Skies they say what would you like to see happening to start getting you know things like the federal Alp to be more supportive on queer stuff for example to get all of politics to be more supportive. I mean, yes, it's greens and some of the crossbenchers are doing good things. But when we know the liberal party is what the liberal party is in most cases, but sorry dinosaurs or hang on the dinosaurs could sue us for

Ation, they could get it there. What what what what can what can we be doing proactively to try and get things rolling as well as Arts?

You know, that's a really great question. I feel like I've become a little bit jaded around Community activism, but I think noise and agitation and disrupting system from the inside is the best way that we can we can agitate for change.

Oh, look it's until we get better representation of you know in Parliament in all aspects, you know, it's still a boys club up there in Canberra. I don't think we're going to see Monumental change at all. Unfortunately. I'm very jaded and cynical about this could imagine if we had like a trans prime minister wouldn't that just be fantastic? Well, yeah, that'd be great. Well, look, I think could be good. Although I'll just say it interesting piece.

Of news has popped up in my Facebook feed I posted on Friday a piece about how there's a Liberal Liberal Party women's Network. And I jokingly put did the the daylight have their last meeting in the last phone booth. Well, it's just emerged in the age today. It is very very important. And it's something that's gets discussed as a lot of our 3 CR shows that know the fabulous freedom of species which comes up at 1:00 did one of the show on this some years ago and they're get gu es today is Kyle Baron.

And a bond AI in animal advocacy so that there's another form of course of social justice of which there are many shows to listen to on 3 CR but yeah, you've got to look after yourself very very much. So and you know, I think that is important and you know, it's it can be very difficult. When you see things that you believe are in simple language going wrong. It's not happening, but you just cannot put yourself into gear or sometimes you've got to
