What is transpired? How did it come about? Tell us all about it. It was such a big project. So it all started at part of our footscray which is a fantastic career venue in foot.

Gray a ventured there. One night and met some gorgeous strands people and didn't know much about it. So, they told me their stories and we end up becoming like the closest of friends, and they were just the most beautiful people inside and out and heard quite quite similar things from various people about, you know, halfway through the Journey. They're not sure what they're doing with makeup or, you know, struggling to feel confident and

Don't fall within themselves inside a now and I've been a makeup artist for about 13 years and I'm like, okay let's let's do some some makeovers and because I want you to feel beautiful because everyone deserves to feel that. So one of my friends is a photographer, his name is Adam Lane and Emmeline photography on Facebook and we decided to do some massive weakens at prior to that there were 12 hour days where the girls would come in and Adam would say, okay bring all your outfits and

I'll help style you. And then, I would do the hair and makeup, and then we take some beautiful photos, which you can see in that magazine. Mmm. But along with the photos, are some gorgeous stories about their journey. And, you know, the highs and the lows of the Journey of transitioning and just becoming your authentic self and they were so powerful that we thought, okay, next level that let's turn this into a beautiful book and get it out to the public. Cool. So, there's a lot in there to unpack and dive into more.

A towel. I mean, yeah, sort of, I must admit I've never been to Pride of our footscray and I've only had wonderful things about it. There's lots of good times, had their, I think. And if I have it, right, I think drag Bingo, might be on that. That was the best. That was the first time I went there and drag. Bingo in that was such a blast ody, well, ever got sick. Where I live a lot for a lot of good reasons. The. But yeah, they were just chatting to trans people. I do the dive into that a bit more, you know, sort of what two parts. So I'll just go with the first thing. What sort of things came out about trans lives generally for you as someone who will say hadn't had a little as and I'm not going to assume anything I presume. You're a cisgender person. Yep hadn't had a lot of contact with trans people prior it was really eye-opening.

For me, I guess, because the general public can be very judging with that sort of thing and and when you get to actually hear their stories and their Journeys, it's just so much power and and salt like confidence that comes out of that and so much respect, you know, that's a really hard thing to do and they were just beautiful heartfelt stories and they just really touched my heart. Fair enough. Yeah. And what a drill more into the, the issue issue that point about

About makeup. I mean, you know, look it's if you haven't, I'm safe, you haven't really done a lot of it before. There's certainly, you know, sort of a learning curve to go through. Yeah. So you're and, you know, an experienced makeup artist. So for you it's probably zip tip bing bing bing. You have it never used to be. Yeah tell us about that as well. Yes, I guess anybody. Who needs to play with makeup? Everyone needs to learn.

Somewhere and delete it from your mother, or your sisters, and that sort of thing. But, you know, back in the day I had no eyebrows and blue eyeshadow. So I put myself through some courses and we did a few courses at part of our footscray to transgender workshops. And it's, yeah, I guess everyone has to learn so it was a good place to do some workshops and help people, you know, stick on eyelashes as a nightmare. Hmm. So, getting the right Shades and undertones for your skin is unless you're trained. It's really hard to figure it out.

Yeah. Very very very true and you know if so if a person wants to wear makeup and sort of make yourself feel good, which everyone has a right to do then why not? But it's sort of like, where do you start? And you know, the reality is that some cosmetic companies will just say, oh, you can wear anything, or you can wear any Shades and I don't already colors and I'm not quite sure I buy into that. I mean I didn't got my as they used to say.

How was done some years ago and got the specific Shades worked out and was one of the best things I ever did. My intuition was saying, don't buy this and don't buy that for clothing or makeup. But, you know, there was a lot of pressure, but this is this colors. The latest Trend, I don't care, you know exactly, yeah, don't work for me. And that's what we were trying to teach as well and also keeping the individuality so some people don't want to wear a lot of makeup. Some people might just want to put some mascara on and, you know, groom their brows and that was fine. It's all about just finding

What makes you feel confident? What makes you feel good? That might be no makeup that maybe just figure out some amazing clothes that make you feel good or whatever. You're into cool. Yeah, no look, it's really really important things. So you just started pulling your pulling piece by piece in here Chrissy. You know, you've got yourself with the makeup background but then how do people see it if we can't capture at the moment? So to speak and makeup is only the face, so there's more parts to talk about there as well.

Working through you said you know people said and you said to people, bring your wardrobe somewhere. I mean, you know what, people some people made their Fortune. Good Fortune may have a lot of wardrobe. I mean, it was it possible to, you know, worth considering going to people's places and short list into that happened as well. Not really most of the the models actually I met at pride in, they're not actual models. They're just regular people that go there and in terms of like bringing you your outfit so they would bring

Some things that they would regularly wear but then Adam, our photographer also had some gorgeous jewelry pieces and he would help style them with that or some boots and jackets, just a style, it up a little bit. Hmm. So that was kind of a fun process and other people brought bags and bags and, you know, shopping trolleys worth of clothes and boots. And that was a lot of fun and I dabble in a lot of wigs, so I brought a little suitcases of my wigs to muck around with our cool. Yeah, it was good. Yeah. So we're getting the

Look to get and then we've got to capture it now. I mean, you know, this is something that I don't know. Someone who probably I'm not, wouldn't I would call myself a smartphone photographer at best. Yeah, and sometimes rushed in and get anxious about taking the shots but of course these were wanting to make these look glamorous. Mmm. What was that? Like working with people who as you say, we're not.

In the in the, you know, sort of professional sense of the word models. Yeah, I guess so because I'd done a lot of photo shoots being a makeup artist in the past and I'm doing sets and

movies and things like that. Also, Adam was very good with teaching people how to pose and, you know, lines and all of that on how to make them look, their best selves. He was great. He was just in the models were quite candid as you can see in the book. So I think the candid shots of the most beautiful ones where it's not too posed. But yeah, that's

More. Those photos are very authentic but also Glam and I think that comes down to the lighting and also the venue had lots of really cool places like graffiti walls to stand by and there's like a million little, a gold Chinese cats that you see in the cafe is there was a wall of that which was awesome. Just shoot at some of the girls are up on top of the bar, that was really fun.

Yeah. Yeah that looks right now to get back, I'm riding the motor went on with that. We got more of an idea because we became more experience with shooting these photos and yeah, okay. I knew that Donna. She's in the book, she has this gorgeous, seventies Corvette. We said bring it to the front of the foot screen market and will shoot you laying on top of this, gorgeous Corvettes. That was a lot of fun. And Stevie, one of our other lovely models, has this great Harley Davidson, we took it to an Alleyway next to Pride with all this graffiti and just shot her.

All over that and it's just she's on the last page. Yeah, she looks Fab. Yep. Everyone's bringing their unique selves which I just found really nice. Yeah, so you've got photographers, you know, you've got makeup, you've got clothes and then we've got to get it together into a book. Yeah. How did that part? Come together. Yeah. So this is the funny story about how this book came about. I already knew Adam

Previously working with him on photo shoots but I got a pride a lot and have a good dance and a few drinks and there was a girl behind the bar called River Norman and she's like, she's like she writes so I'm like, oh great can you edit some of our stories? So she came on board to edit the stories and yet it's like we met everybody at Pride either behind the bar on the dance floor because we told everyone about this project I was telling everyone and anyone who will listen because I was so excited.

About it. We had a videographer who I met on the dance floor at pride and I said, I'll be doing this great project and he's like, I would love to be involved and everyone donated that time and he's taken some beautiful videography, and behind the scenes and interviews of all the models. And his name's Aaron McGuire from McGuire Productions. He did a fantastic job and he also played in the band at our launch party, cool. And their band's name.

Is only bands so that was really fun. Only bad only bed just can subscribe for more later out of that and leave it. I got it. Yeah got it got it, got it, got it, got it just you know, sort of gets just took a moment to click in. They're not they don't have a long weekend coffee. Yes and happy Easter to roving reporter, one of our awesome listeners on the show.

And yeah. So you've got the whole thing together, and all these pieces came together and from the time of will say, initial reasonably initial conception to the launch, which was, as we said Monday the 31st of March 20 25. How long was that? Yes, sir. Look at started about two years ago. Wow's it. Yeah. And then I got diagnosed with ADHD anxiety, depression, and complex PTSD. During that time, which was quite a hard

Diagnosis to swallow. It felt like my life kind of fell apart for a minute and I lost the connection with the book and the project almost didn't didn't come to him. We didn't get any funding so that was also really hard and just sort of like a kick in the guts every time that happened. So with all of that I kind of lost my motivation for about a year and a half and then I do it happened one day.

I just kind of decided I need to finish this book because it's not about me. It was about everyone else.

And everyone who donated their time, and I just kick myself in the butt and I hustled and we got it done. So it was also funded, but the profits of the book are going to transgender Victoria because we want to put back into the community and support people even more. First of all, yeah, look every strength to you on dealing with the things you mentioned. And even the mention of them are some of those I will save people are if any distress or they need.

Masks and all those sorts of things. That's an incredible effort, Chrissy, so much appreciated. And I'm, I'm, well, I'm staggered and I have to say somewhat annoyed in a bit angry that there was not one bit of supportive funding know that was hard. Yep. So that kind of just motivated us even more, but at the end of the day, we found an amazing printer. And that's I guess how the book came to life again and got to where it is. So, Ran's printing out in.

Box Hill gave us a great deal on the book and like I said, everyone donated their time so that was a blessing. One of our graphic designer stepped up and a lie. I know we could Pope, she works for hello idea, and she's another foot screen Ian. I like to call everyone and she designed this beautiful magazine and everyone's contributed selflessly and it's just it's such a good project. Is an absolute Love Project, absolute. Well, absolutely, certainly not for the money and I'll just join in a

As in course of children of the West, the red, the white, the blue. And you had I see did get some support from Bulldog pride, by the way. Yeah, we did for all of our lovely contributors on the back there of, you know, how it out, flag High. We'd love to get some more Multicultural diversity in there and I think it'll be great because it was just, it was such a massive project. It was exhausting, there was tears. You had a great idea, why we're listening to Kevin Johnson to read one of the stories out and I know you selected one, but I'm just going to be okay. Let's go drum. Roll drum roll. We have opened up at filling the book Bree. So I'm going to read Briggs brief story, word for word picture. This, it's the holiday season and a teacher is preparing the class for their annual Christmas concert when she asks, who wants to wear?

Stockings for Santa's helpers, most of the boys in the class refused. However, one boy. Yeah, I'm reading this verbatim. I'm sure you can guess who excitedly raises his hand and begs to be. Chosen yelling, pick me, choose me and he was this one moment created a domino effect that would change the trajectory of my life forever. I continued dressing up in women's clothing off and in my mother's entered relationships with them in women and continuing this pattern in secret, my passion for cross-dressing only increasing as time went on.

Tan, I then found myself married and quickly became a father to an amazing son. And so, for the next five years, my cross-dressing ceased, after a rocky period, with my mental health and fail to help from professionals. I began talking to a transgender woman online, who recommended I started hormones. So I thought, why not? You only live once. So with her encouragement, I purchased some online and began my transition.

At work, I dressed in feminine clothing with long nails, and blond hair and it is so liberating. I grew up with little information about transgendered individuals and spent years questioning who I was and why it was different. But now I'm finally living as the woman. I have always been and I'm thankful every day that we live in a world where is possible. I now have Community is still marginalized heavily heavily, but if you look back at the world 30 years ago, we've certainly come a long way. So everyone is who is unsure of curious. Please reach out this community is a big one and in it.

You will always find a home in quite brief story. I think that sums it up pretty well, particularly you've. And I'm maybe a little biased, is someone who's probably passed the halfway mark in life. There's a lot of emphasis in this book on older trans people although all ages were

welcomed and I sometimes feel we neglect or perhaps a not quite including enough stories of old trans people in this day and age of internet where everyone thinks everyone can come out. So I'm biased as I

Maybe really pleased that you've done that Chrissy. Now there's a lot of power in Breeze, words there. Yeah, yeah. There's a lot of power in all of their words and all their stories are so uniquely different and it's hard. Some of the journeys are really hard but they seem to push on. And it usually comes from the confidence of friends and just having that support network. That's really important. And there's so much courage because they just keep going. Yep, allyship is the thing. So,

So critical for Trans people at any time, we'll say, particularly at the moment. And yep. You want to do Volume 2 and I'll announce the world that you've got your first suck. I mean, violent nice. Seriously. I love it. We love to have you as part of it, that would be amazing. Bit of Glamour and some ideas are shooting through my head already. It's time to get your your runway walk as well. Oh, okay. Alright well we're work. We'll talk later, we'll talk.

Will do coffee or something lunch or whatever we do. But seriously love to and I urge people to have a bit of fun feel energized, look, good, feel good. And, you know, if there's makeup classes as is look, I've been, you know, out actually, it's just struck me. It's 30 years next Sunday. Since I came out to myself, which I don't really talk about that much anymore. But, you know, look, I still feel. I've got Day makeup and night makeup worked out, but

Cameron, anything else is like, wow. So I'm so always came to. Let me need to keep learning on things, so I'd be glad to be a part of that. Just look up big red lipstick on. Yeah, it looks like Instagram reach out to me and I definitely doing a lot of transgender makeup workshops. So, yeah, reach out and I've got you. Cool. That would be awesome. So yet there you go. I'm trying to lead by example. I'm sure it was so hard to do that. Seriously, I'd love to be part of it. Chrissy, I think we've got it covered.

Now, I don't understand how that can be called Justice. It might be law, but I don't quite get it myself.

Yeah, that's for starters. So there wasn't really evidence to say what from a transport of view. I'm really quite astounded by that. Now, I haven't read the Judgment yet, I admit that it's something I really want to brace myself for and look at carefully. But what I've seen of it, my personal opinion is it seems very vague.
