Where did it all? Start? How did it all start?

What happened doing, what Tonio did what are the details of? Which are aware of? That might be a good place to dive in. Yeah, sure. It started before my time a little bit before I came out. Anyway, being a late bloomer, that I was one person was thinking some support, it was probably about 18 or 19 at the time of the time. The boc was running I think an Italian group and

Possibly another group, couple of other groups were running around the same time, and he approached them to see if he could start up something great. And that's how basically started at the same time and that was primarily for guys and that the same time, roughly, someone else was starting up a girl's group for Greek girls or hell. And he goes. Yeah, and yeah, that's it.

How I pretty much started is the support groups that people could come and just talk to others within their culture and discuss their issues just run by normal people. Now, one with specific qualifications or anything. Yeah, like Pierre, Pierre, sort of work. That's how pretty much started packing.

95 cool. Yeah, we just developed from there and then we started having some swamp, keeping the meetings, going every couple of weeks or every month. Then we started having some events as we got braver and we just developed from there.

Sounds sounds excellent. And and much-needed, you know, sort of, you know, there is, there is a need now Force. Obviously, for specific spaces. I think within rainbow communities, whether it's a particular, Multicultural, or faith. Whether it's, you know, let's say for example, in people with variation of sex, characteristics will need a particular space, all that sort of thing. What were the sort of things that were coming up? I'm going to say from what you're what you're aware of of

Of course, in the group will say in further back times, let's start there, what sort of things came up from specifically? I'll say, let's say the dip, the differences and the similarities to will so I'll use the term the broader rainbow community. So someone just someone who is lgbtiq generally. Yeah look. I mean we had I mean back then things were obviously a lot different from what they are now and the

Common issues that sort of came through was similar to other cultures minority cultures but also items that the broader gay community was dealing with. So religion was a big one because a large proportion of the great Community. Is Faith bait in the Greek Orthodox Church, which has

Has good points and bad points in itself. Yeah, it does congregate us together, which is good, but conversely being gay, it does create quite a few issues dealing with Stanley was another one, but the ones that I think I'd just, you know, realized through our group was that family was really important. Whether regardless of the issues that the children may have had

And I think in my 30 years on you heard about one person thrown out of home effectively. Okay. So from that aspect it was more capable of dealing with our families is specifically for living at home still. Yeah, obviously a lot of gay people regardless of their ethnicity left home to live in the biggest cities or to leave

Referring a life somewhere else which made it easier. I think dealing with family in that respect. Yeah, acceptance within the broader. Great Community. I think was another thing being feeling safe to go to Greek events that were happening around us. Whether that was big Lonsdale street festival or performers can begin from overseas or

All that sort of stuff. It was always something new, something different, but in and coming out, obviously, was another big one, when's the right time, who did you tell? Do you tell you come

out, you know. And again you know everyone just relayed, their learning experiences and then we took it from there.

They're just like I said, you know, I heard stories from other people and when I had to deal with it, at least I had some knowledge of what they possibly expect. Yeah. So that and that's the thing though that. I think one of the things that a group, like, Greek angels can offer, from what I think I've seen is that if someone's been down the path before it means, at least, well,

He's an analogy. This at least a donkey track, if not a path, if not even a paved road, so to speak, that can sort of give people a guide, so there's not Reinventing of Wheels. Yeah, yeah and then you know, there's that sense of relief you're not alone which must you know, when you can feel that way even though you know, of course the radically we're not and we can go into big arguments about how the war big spiritual

Debates about how the world is interconnected or something, all those sorts of things. Yeah. Then you know, it just makes it easier. You know, when people turn up to the group The First Time, the very first time, you know what's that like and then what's described a little, how it, what the process and how it feels for the people who come to the group and then get that sense of connection. Look, I can, I mean I've heard a few stories from different people but

From my perspective, it was really daunting because, you know, back, then you thought about well, what happens if I say someone, I know, you know, because it's a small community as while it's quite big, it's still very small and you think your gee, you know, wasn't was it?

It out of the time and a lot of the members that come to the group or not all of them, but quite a lot and not come out yet when they came to the group. So there's always been an issue, you know, of being found out inadvertently by turning up. But you know that that was put to rest pretty quickly because we were very confidential and, you know, you made sure that, you know, even if you did not

Into someone later on, but you were quite discreet and didn't mention that, you know, where you met in somewhat. I'm lost as friends. Do you know, you walking down the street? And you talk to someone and someone know where, you know, them from, you know, how? So you have to be a little bit discrete in that respect, but I found that I quickly got into it really, really easily because I suddenly

Started hearing about experiences that other people were having just took their General lives. I'm just so relieved, you know, the gay life but he now great like, you know, that our mothers and our fathers and our siblings and grandparents and you think you know the things you hear from other people resonated in your own life. So you quickly well I found

Quickly adapted, really well and Tuesday, I think the bulk of my close friends. I met through the group. Yeah. So you know, someone in my case who was previously married and had lost contact with pretty much everyone from their past life, the group provided a mechanism for me to

Polish my community so to speak. Yeah, yeah, yeah. We all need community and connection as humans and so they must have been just a huge boost and that you know, one gal me. So I hope I'm certainly hoping there was. But, you know, that did that sort of boost come then sort of boost you as a person I'm imagining and it can kind of go from there. Yeah, I mean, you know, I mental health is really important.

As we discover these days which we didn't really think about those days, not tonight. No, I wasn't really on the right. However, the agenda of the time. But, you know, looking back obviously having connections and, you know, and I remember when one of my friends, when I, when my parents found out and I was talking to the guy that was running the group at the top,

Time and he said, look, I'll put some on some in touch with you who aren't you. And so he, you know, this person right me and mothers knew each other so he could just get your man that killed my mother and I can beat you better together so you know, part of my language here. So you know, there was that sort of, you know, whether you call it

I think of the word right now, and usual support that you could get from the group. Yep, with that I've had some questions come in, John from one of our awesome, recurring listeners. And, you know, sort of the question is that some might and groups and these are the words stuck in the past.

The gay relationship which didn't last very long, but he was there for a while, you know, it opens a few eyes and started some conversations, which was good here. The issue I think.

Is more for Our Generation, not for the younger generation. But as generation, our parents came out here in the sixth season. Pretty much stayed in the 60s. Yeah. After all the they kept all all the, thank you about Grace didn't change for them here. Even though Australian was progressing, they kept to their old ways. So to speak.

So, the gauge is not something that you would generally come across some area, but obviously has as

That generation is passing on and you Generations are coming through, you know, keep don't have the same issues that we have any Kill Ya, you know, they're free to do whatever they want. Some still have issues you oh, my come around. So we might someone make contact us and say, oh, my parents are only great but my grandparents are really creating issues or you know, that sort of stuff there is the odd.

102 of a generation that is still creating issues for the kids but generally taking life is much better now and that goes for both here. And back in Grace, my family knows, I mean initially it was a

bit of an issue for me but you know, progressively the bulk of them done. Most of them don't have an issue. As far as I know,

Which is the cool thing. Our correspondent driving has also coming with some more comments in that roving hit mentioned having an openly gay, Greek Impe like Steve Demopolis in the victim. Not to generalize while still respecting everyone's journey and roving also says, no, many Greeks who are open and Progressive even with faith. Its cultural not religious. Yep. So I'm just going to get all these comments in. Also roving, remembers the classic film head-on bike. Kristen psilakis featuring the other great men, with course, Alex Dimitri Artis, and there's been other stories and driving has asked. And is also said, right? Oakley in a nutshell,

Even though there's middle class Greeks who are above the Nets bits of everything. You know, they even want to see the 60 pesos or on screen. And you have, for us is no big deal. But for some sectors within the broader, Greek Community was an issue and I remember even at the Greek Film Festival one year when in-store again a fiend film and you know, you got the reactions when

They saw a guy kiss. Another guy, you got the negative reactions within the cinema itself. Yeah. And these are people that you know people go to festivals that generally quite open-minded. So surprised by that having

Having great people here in Melbourne. Come out when they've got some status like politicians or journalists or whatever the case may be is great. Yeah, because it's it, you know, reinforces our existence so to speak but I think what is more important than that is for the leaders of Greek.

Patient's opaque, Greek organizations to actually come out and say something. Hmm, I remember during marriage equality, we didn't get any of that. There was someone that was part of an organization that got a petition together and got it signed by quite a few people with great background to support marriage equality, but it wasn't done on behalf of an organization. I think some activists in our community forums is type of behaviour to especially by Banning Police. March in Pride Events, maybe it's time we had

Some self-reflection how we can move forward and be still be Progressive by not making errors in judgment that reflect younger Generations. Still very sad though to see an embed defeated. Love, your thoughts have a great show. Thank you, Jenny. Yeah, look, I think there's a lot in that now, look, I wouldn't the last thing I claim to be as a super subsurface apologist that is someone who analyzes elections and that sort of thing. So whether there is that idea from con that, you know,

People who were greens voters have gone to labor who are somewhat further, right? I'm not you know look there it's probably some some truth to that I think in Adam Ban seat I think there was a bit of a redistribution I think it is also I think there's a few other factors. I think it is fair to say that with liberal and labor, sort of preferencing each other. Higher. That would have pushed greens out in some of the seats. They were aiming to hold or win that has to be a factor.

Some people will say for right or wrong, that they shifted too far left. Some will say, they didn't, you know, sort of, but you've I think it's for that one. I think I'd be looking very carefully at the people who are saying it, some will be critical of advanced and right-wing funded groups. But the thing that I I'll lead into once, when we will talk about, that is one another Point as well is, you know, the you know, what's happened? Post-election

In terms of our own Community self reflection on how we can move forward. Yes, we do. And there's, I'd like to recommend a good blog on that by Phaedra's. Who Bart h Ou b, R8 E, I think he was French Canadian and you can get it via sub stack. I believe he's writing very strongly. He's American North American base. So obviously what's happening in North America is of grave concern to us. Let's see if I can squeak in a comment on that as well. Gosh there's so much going on.

And he's riding very carefully on how our queer movement, can sort of, get get things back on what's going wrong, and he's a good Rider. So, check that one out. I'll put a, put a link to that into the podcast, because I think that's worth promoting. So I think we do need to reflect but I also want to link that back to the Australian and strain and election situation. So, look going back. Nearly where is it a week? I have to admit, I was kind of stunned.

It was relatively over that quickly. You know, 828, I believe, was the official call time for The Sensational, Anthony Green, give or take a second or two and there it was, you know? So and I mean, really, although the booths close at 6:00 Australian eastern time. There's nothing really coming in until 7:00. So an hour and a half is a pretty quick count. I mean, he would have obviously been disappointed and possibly even distressed yet. He did that very, very calmly and he's going to do the right thing and disappeared. And there were some people in America saying, I wish we had the

Price of politicians like that, which is which says something. So gosh, your strategy should something good. And look, I'm obviously disagree with Peter dutton's policies, on virtually everything, but credit for that speech. And if he says he's going to sort of move away from public life or not comment on politics as much is what he said. Then that's I think very awesome and you know I'm good luck to him. I have to say I've been disappointed with the sort of the head kick.

Of the greens. It just seems there is from not that I wasn't aware of it and I don't think anyone was this idea that liberal and labor, just trying to get the grains out whether and and their Associates, media, pseudo, sort of groups political groups like Advanced. What if they do and not that, I really want to know very, I just think it's been very ungracious of Alban easy in the week since now.

This is where I should say this, everything on this show is strictly my own opinion. Is strictly my own opinion my way back over 20 years ago when I was on another Community station, I interviewed Anthony Albanese e about I can't even remember what it was about but all I remember was just how aggressive and Rudy was and is that coming out? Does he have a you know what happened to being was? It old saying if you lose say little, if you win say less well you know be a gracious winner so to speak. It's not very much gracious.

On him.

So, yep. Yeah, I think that's very disappointing. In terms of linking in what a, let's go through the analysis. So labor, obviously, you know, they've had a huge Victory and that has to be respected. But are they showing respect to, you know, that sells story. We're going to bring Australians together yet. You're already had kicking the greens and those sorts of people, I don't think that's good. What will let's go through other parties will obviously the Liberals decimated conservatism and sort of the

Dog whistle politics. Seems like it's been rejected, there's a mandate to say that which is very, very good. They're going to have to do some rethinking, how they get back to, you know, exclaiming, the circle so-called Center smaller, liberal moderate sort of Base, but then it's the thing is, they've been decimating that for 40 years since just after the phrase aronow Fraser, Mi know, obviously, not my popular person on this station. Probably, but look, he had some conservatism it isn't. But he was

Also somewhat smaller liberal in a lot of ways. In particular, on things like foreign policy. He was somewhat ahead of his time and ever since the mid-80s after he lost the smaller liberal, link wing, and smaller liberal part of the lit, the Big L. Liberal party has been decimated how they're going to get it back and rebuild it overnight. I don't know. Now that be many of the senses to this station saying not our problem. Fair enough greens look obviously, as I said there,

Be some who say they went too far left and maybe. But maybe for the time some will say, they didn't communicate their message. Well enough, they could have and this is only a guess, a thought bubble said, you know, we don't agree with what Israel is doing in Palestine, but we want peace in the Middle East, but the message has been that anyone who hasn't been strongly pro-israel in societies being trampled on by powerful institutions. Maybe they were part of that. There will

Also, redistributions preferencing and I think came into it for the greens. I don't think it's as Astor. They haven't looked, they haven't gone backwards in the Senate and their primary vote in the Reps. Hasn't gone backwards too far. Just they lost seats that maybe were a bit of a high water. Mark last time given the despair, that people are facing with the, then, Morrison government over the environment teals. And this is where I want to come into one of roving messages as I'm running rapidly out of time.
