I mean, you know, I just find it worrying that we seem to be becoming more polarized and extreme on so many issues nowadays and I don't think that's accidental. Now it's often been said that the real, you know, we often hear of the world from fate sort of play

Dina perspective of left versus right, which I don't agree with the real battle, is moderation versus extremism and often to me the extreme left and the extreme route, right? Sound extremely similar. When we go to regime's over time, we look at Nazi, Germany, and we look at Soviet Russia and really where they any much different. I don't think so. So, I think we need to be careful and we look at today, you know, I'll be very cautious in

What I say but the fact that it the appearance can be given at times that turfs and Neo-Nazi seem to find Common Ground. Hello, you know there's the parent extreme left and the apparent extreme, right? So yeah you know let's just get back to some moderation but where has this idea come from that it has become polarized. Well, have certain people been writing for years that scoffing at the sensible Centre? Well,

Who will as writers, what was their motive who were those people communicating that that's worth thinking about as well. So call me an old-fashioned hippie or something for, you know, peace, love and understanding seventies. But why can't we have that? Do we have to be, you know, a particular background to comment on an issue in terms of just saying, hey can't we just have kindness and respect and treat every person on how the basis of how each individual behaves not?

So you know let's try to get some kindness back. I know that all sounds very woo. Woo and peace love and understanding but maybe the only thing we can really do is just to quietly. Do it in our own lives every day and see where that takes us. We try

Even if it's one to one too many and you can imagine that if we did say are cisgender men are on a shooting epidemic you could hear the cries of Alec Not all men come from shock shock jock wannabes and others further to the right. You could hear them from in Dandenong from

Melbourne without a radio signal. So all I can say to trans people. Allies decent humans is sort of, let's rebut the nonsense. Let's keep our cool.

And all that sort of thing, and make sure that we sort of can keep doing that. But it is frustrating. Obviously, when, you know, we have to deal with these these bits of nonsense all the time, it's really really stressful and bewildering. So I did just want to throw that note in. But as I say in what with the words of a sponsor, go kindly this show does come together sometimes.
