It wasn't as I understand it in accordance with government regulation. So the ban was lifted only for a, sadly a few hours later, the Queensland government to then apparently do the right process. So we're now back to square one now, first and foremost, this is obviously incredibly disappointing for the 491.

People at the time who were were not at who were not able to access puberty blockers, whether they've been able to access them through support from other states and territories is sort of the next question and we know there's been efforts made to do that but it's certainly

I am you know, a very well upsetting thing that is going on up there and you know, sort of we've also seen in the last couple of weeks. The Northern Territory government make highly inappropriate remarks about trans women and sister girls in women's prisons and that's probably in response or probably not in response. It's the liberal the country Liberal Party.

Which is effectively for all intents and purposes. The same thing as the liberal National Party just a slightly different name in the Northern Territory stemming from the old when the national party was the country party which country. I'm not sure but that's another debate anyway, the Coalition will call it that for Simplicity up there saying no to that which of course is not appropriate and puts. Trans women in danger. Now I'm not going to Dubai Daffy. I wish you like trans women in women's prisons, you know, sort of the, the arguments just based on sort of, on emotionalism, which covers up the simplicity exaggeration, generalization, and outright often nonsense, that are so much of the, what I will call the anti-trans debate, put up, because when you boil it down, a lot of it is all of those things.

As if not my if not or close to all of it. Now it's like something where there may be a tiny grain of truth but you know, sort of a scores its end blown out of all proportion. What I want to concentrate on in this situation. There was a great article in Friday's crikey by The Fabulous Natalie Feliks, which I want to quote from and Natalie Feliks is a writer activist and critic from Melbourne /name, who's written for range of publications covering rights for trans and neurodivergent people from a feminist lens. She talks about the response and how what groups have done and not done and how have some groups trans Justice project and Equality Australia instantly claimed Victory. She says how health Minister Tim Nicholls issue the initial band without proper consultation but he's now issued reinstituted the ban. And then she says, Natalie says sorry, I don't know, Natalie's pronouns, the reaction from the trans Community was Swift confused and Furious. Actually, she says she in here, so I'm going to go with she apologize. If that's not the ones Natalie users, but I can crikey, I think is generally good on that sort of thing

and how was the Defiance of a Court ruling possible and it's a possible to sue the states Minister And the problem is that the health minister as much as obviously, the trans Community doesn't like it acted as the judge said from to do it starts now, not unlawful and Queensland will continue with its review of puberty blockers. And we, of course, we are waiting on a federal inquiry, which is supposed to be more objective and this is where we get into. What?

Matters. I think perhaps to the community to unpack. Exactly why what happened? Why this happened in this way? We need to investigate this present situation of trans rights in Australia and the responsibility of not-for-profits for it, we're getting down to some critical issues here in. This is what I'm going to issue the content note, a Content node for possible discussion of lateral hostility. You notice, there's certainly been these attacks from Queensland and all the territory, governments and trans.

Have been held in as our male compounds in Australia, in terms of immigration, as well as so-called prisons. Not that I want to use that word, incarceration, whatever, whatever sort. And this Natalie talks about Filipino transwoman Sonia who was held for eight weeks and it was denied hormones and Medical Care supervision by male guards.

And there's raids on sex worker workplaces and now sort of and the then she gets to the guts of Natalie gets to the guts of this article. Quote about why these sorts of issues, she's discussing aren't being discussed in her opinion quote, there's a clear reason for this not-for-profit will choose campaigns that are respectable and easy to win because one of their driving obligations is to raise money or not.

Profit that Strays too far from the mainstream risks. Upsetting it's wealthy supporters and potentially losing its charity status all together. They put a lot of time and resources into acting like their flag, bearers of progress and advocacy without doing any of the actual work that fighting for change requires campaigns are fought over decades, by Grassroots groups and activists, who faced police violence media condemnation and routine, abuse only for not-for-profits to sweep up the credit for a campaign success. Equality Australia are particularly no Tory's for this from the same-sex marriage, campaign to the introduction of self-id in Queensland, and New South Wales, a few years ago, end quote now for me to resume comments. Yeah. Well a lot of people think that do I think that, yes, and when birth certificate reform in Victoria went through Parliament? In 2019. Thankfully, there was enough strength, down here to push back against equality Australia. There's a lot of criticism. They are not, they don't have a membership base, you can't really tell me I'll get involved in their policy. It's a very closed club and who tells them what for to advocate for and how and the lack of action from the federal government on trans issues and outright transphobia. It hasn't Truth For example, Tran Anthony Albanese he raising and vilifying trans men of few years ago, by saying men can't have babies. It's just one example, but we'll equality Australia. Stand up for Trans people know, and will I stand up for intersex people? We are, of course in the middle of a very important period for intersex, people with intersex awareness, day and intersex Remembrance Day on the 25th of October and yesterday respectful respectfully respectively and yet, intersects were thrown under the bus in the census last year. Where was the support from a quality Australia? If they're so powerful and have the door of the federal cabinet and the ear? Why can't they get stopped these things happening? And I want to come back to that one later on. So,

And yes, it if there's a lot of been to a lot of talk that there's a lot of different petitions, at least two, or three going around since the reintroduction of the quick reintroduction of the ban and petitions are all very well, but are they just data harvesting so people can sell? We've got 60,000 members, when it's just 60,000 people who at Levitt signed at least one petition by the

organization, tough questions. But these are the debates that we need to be having these are and I'm going to be quite deliberate, in my words here and then leave you to listen to the music. Now, sort of the, I'm going to explain this next, you know? These are the conversations that need to happen anyway. Yeah. That in the context of a quality Australian, which whilst that wasn't technically in existence at the time, the same people behind it who were part of the then human rights law centers, lgbti unit, sort of it was pretty much for all intents and purposes. The same sort of setup and unaccountable lobbying unit with no grass, roots input. And the quality project started out in my honest opinion is a good thing. It was trying to bring

Validate, firm visible eyes. If you like the needs of groups for my personal live identity, bi and trans, others like intersects Ace and you know, seem to do good work. However, the developments that have happened in the last six weeks or so. Well, have now. Well, put a huge question mark over that not to say that there wasn't one before maybe there were smaller ones, I was aware over the

Is but and of issues where, okay, I want to be clear. We are none of us can be 100% perfect on diversity because everyone's individual experience is different and we can know broad brush strokes but we can't always get it right but if some if a mistake happens you learn from it you put it in your memory data Bank in your head, and you don't do it again. And this is where I had heard issues with the equality project before that they weren't.

Taking on feedback. And given a part of their leadership training talks about what most people call constructive criticism on the ability to learn and be open to that they call it negative feedback. I think we I'm not going to split hairs on which is a better term or right or wrong. That was a problem and then these podcasts emerged called Brave conversations. Now we do need to have Brave conversation such as the one Natalie Felix, you know, has had opened up in her crikey

Article we do need to have conversations about who speaks for whom and at the heart of this and this is where we get to the guts of lateral hostility. So raising the content at level. Here to cisgender gay. Men were talking about trans and women's issues. Now, cisgender people talking about trans with no trans input is appalling. Now, I want to make a clear. Obviously, I don't agree with gender critical perspectives, but the fact that two men were talking about women's issues of any sort was equally as bad and it was a very poor show, and I was listened to half of that particular episode and turned off. And the fact that they were saying all we should compromise on women, safe spaces. Who is we, where does that leave trans people? Look at the stupidity of the UK, where, what's no one knows? Where trans people are supposed to change, or relieve themselves, or whatever? Now, because of an totally non-existent, meaningless term being biological men,

Biological women, not defined in law, not cannot be defined. Clearly nature and wasn't even debated in the stupid Supreme Court case over there. I'm not sure whether it can be appealed to the European Court of Rights or whether that's going to happen or who can do it. So a very and the fact that they've also the fact that the cisgender man guests with Jason tries and machine was someone from the UK which doesn't understand Australian law. I just I just find that so many fails and and I felt incredibly disappointed, but I also have to be critical of two of the other episodes which all, I think all episodes have now been pulled one. I have a lot of respect for Jac Tomlins but there seemed to be some idea that if you were too traumatized to sit in advocacy spaces, it was almost like, don't sit there. Well, that rules out about 99.94% of lgbtqa+ people because we've all got some and we never know when it's going to come up and we can't just all be calm and polite and do this now.

Middle-class politeness, we have to have, we're going to, you know, there's going to be things that trigger us and we might not be easy to just learn and get through it. Some of these traumas can be very deeply buried and just say we should stop or imply that we should stop or do less. Yeah, it's also, I think a bit of classes and not all of us can afford the therapy that we might, like, or the techniques that we might want, or get access to it. So that was critical in the third one. And I know this person's been a guest on this show a few times Ro Allen made one remark that left me. Infuriated about the census where Rose said. We didn't educate enough on intersex. Who's we intersex people? And as an educator, I spend more time on intersex and I do on LGB, most of the time in sessions because people don't understand it. They haven't heard of it. I've had people say they've never heard the word before to me, or, I've had people say, there's no such actually had people say, there's no such thing as intersex, which and they're not being into phobic by any sense, they just honestly, haven't heard of it. There's only two bodies at Birth. No, there isn't. There's forty as Paula Gerber sit on this show. A few weeks ago, there's at least 40 types of chromosomes alone, which gets us away from, in inverted, commas, expected male and female. So these podcasts were really poor. Now the initially the equality project issued a statement, that was a bit of the sort of didn't mean it. Sorry if someone took offense and that's my summation not exact words. And then there was a another statement about a week before for saying, the podcasts had been withdrawn and that their people were concerned about the and sort of when it looked alright. At first it seemed like a step forward saying I'll we're listening. But when you look carefully at the words and quite a few people picked up on this, it actually still did not apologize for the content of the

And just trying to find them here as we click through, and many people picked up on this very quickly, we put Source quote, we put sources into the public that the tgD community have been campaigning against as misinformation, but that doesn't say that they've acknowledged that it was information so and quite a few people picked up on that. So yeah, really disappointing. Now my thought was That this might many people said, okay the statements come out, it will hopefully reduce the heat during the Better Together conference in Adelaide last weekend. I haven't heard whether that happened and many people thought I will will this disappear in the news cycle. My feedback from around the traps is that it's not and people are going to keep the pressure up and I think that has to happen because if we are going to get past these issues and start getting looking at him looking at unconscious bias and privilege which we all have to do including myself and I'm sure I don't know all of mine although I find it out, it seems at times, then that's what we need to do.
