We do so that's ridicule obviously things that imply that we automatically offenders for being who we are, or we put people at risk now that's hate speech.

Well that is a crisis for all people, but of course, the more marginalized, you are the better.

Just say that to some extent, the moment I'm facing the degree of what I'm going to call housing insecurity and instability, which is quite frightening, you know, as some for someone who's 60, and I'm sure it is for anyone at any age, but when you've never really thought this could happen because you kind of have this, hope the world in its way, would keep getting better. And we see the ridiculous rise of the right wing, which I know can be over inflated, but it's still scary. So, that's one issue. We've got this issue. Where so many people of all ages, but I think are coming out later in life with autism and ADHD, which I've touched on during this year, but it seems for queer people. It's as I've used this phrase many times before we've got the topsoil effect where things get buried underneath and the ADHD and and or Autism doesn't come out till later. How do we unmask? Do we know what the mask that we're wearing? Looks like all these sorts of things. And then here's the one that'll really high.

No, it's honey. We've got eight minutes left in the show and running out of time but I'm going to raise this, you know a lot of that queer Pioneers. I'm only looking at a Victorian / Australian point of view were were white. Now, yes, we need to have diversity knowledge, people of color but how do we hold space for those people? You know, when we do need to look at seniors and I'm sure of course, there were people of colour, queer, people of colour, doing working days and Years Gone by. But,

We can't eradicate someone's work just because sometimes they were the people doing it and there was more less. Queer people of colour visibility and more white visibility. I don't think there's anything you know, I'm happy to be queried on that but let's have that debate constructively and carefully. These are a lot of debates we need to start having. Because a lot of I look at the lot of the people I saw in the queer communities and is there work, you know, because

You know, I wanted. Yes, it was nice. I have to say, and it was very nice to get an award at the gender Revel Friday. Week ago. Very felt very appreciated, but there's lots of others who maybe haven't been. Is it time we changed that? What do we do about it? All of these sorts of things and there's many, many other issues that we need to cover and I'm sure others will be more. So I'm going to be focusing on this, you know, in coming weeks.

Possibly months. And, you know, put a bit of a strategic purpose into this show. I can't claim to speak for young people. I don't, you know, I can listen to the issues and have some understanding and find similarities and contrast, but obviously, I can't speak for young people because I'm not, I need to be an ally to young people, but I hope in return. We can be allies to each other and have these conversations and promote intergenerational learning. And I think it's something that fits in line with 3. CR side.
