I wanted to share a thought the wonderful Robbie did well, effectively a welcome to Country and talked about How 3 CR. Yeah, sort of was talking about issues that no one else was in terms of Aboriginal issues and giving people a voice and there was a special award given to 3 CR as Treasurer on our committee of management sin whose of Sri Lankan background and how mainstream media didn't give a range of coverage of the issues in Sri Lanka of course 3 CR supporting the Tamil community in with email broadcast on December 25 each year.

And now I've got me thinking as well, something that I have been thinking about a lot in the current climate and what I was thinking which is always dangerous was I think somebody's been here. Now, over 20 years, it ticked over 20 years in March this year. So, I'll have to do a 21st next year, whether they'll be cake or not, I'm not sure we'll the 3 CR budget cover that

I'm not sure, but seriously, but seriously got me thinking of how much support 3 CR is given to trans people. Now, I don't want to be self-indulgent with this next comment, but a few weeks ago, I did win an award for contribute contributions to the transcommunity. And I wanted to bring that in to say that 3 CR has been a huge enough. And I think well, overlooked part of it, because 3 CR is mental.

Lot to me. And in a time, where trans voices were often ignored even in so-called, what we would Now call Igbtiq A Plus circles. I mean, we were back in the day, you know, we were still using phrases like gay and lesbian. And then people would say, what about trans and we'd get the. I'm going to say content, small content, no mention of lateral, hostility are why they say many letters in the alphabet. And I wish I had said at some point that well, why don't we drop the G and L and see what the response was? I never said that.

The 3 CR was there even before I started this program. In 2005 3 CR was having more nuanced debates about trans issues. Even if perhaps the trans people were not involved, there

was some good, allyship, yours. Truly joined the station after being with another one, which is in the past, not going to go say any more than that. And I felt very supported here not just as a presenter but also as a person and there is a sense of

Community where we help each other out, where we can with our network switch on a couple of fronts. I'm just going to say I'm needing at the moment and threes I've been very grateful for that but in terms of the present rather than just getting nostalgic about the past, the thing that I wanted to bring up, is, I mean, 3 CR has always in terms of trans issues, being well ahead, and in the current climate without wanting to brag or anything, I really think that we are, you know, perhaps one of the best place media outlets in Victoria, may be sticking the neck out a little, the best place to lead proactively on giving trans people voices and a range of trans people. I am very clear. I'm an old trans person. I may have slightly different perspectives but we've got a range of perspectives with shows like clearing the air with Madison and Oscar at 3:00, which covers trans issues. We've got other trans shows and queer shows which gives space and many of our other shows such as art shows, and music shows will play trans artists in the broader sense of that word.]

And I feel like we're in a position to really be a well, do you A big word, a bulwark is that the word, I'm some sort of buffer against the nonsense. We can't do it all, and we obviously would like more, but I think we're in a position to lead and it's just really important in this time that 3 CR, does that. So wanting to do more of that and also has a say. As a says, a someone is hit the seniors. Yes, I have a senior's card in my pest now. Goodness Me still don't know how we got there but we come here.

Seriously want to do something you know, to contribute to that. And so would love your thoughts over that. I'm on that on. What more you know what else, 3 CR can do. I know this programs here in a sudden many of the others but I think we're in a position to do something about it. But 3 CR, I think, as I say great sense of community and very, very important. But we also want, I'm also wanted to acknowledge as suggested by roving reporters 3, CR winning some awards and making finals are various Awards recent times, which was announced yesterday and reminded me to sort of had it on the radar to go through this three winners at the recent Community broadcasting Association of Australia Awards in early November 3. CR breakfast shows took away best program for news and current affairs. I Will Rise content night here for what I call transphobia Trans woman was described as quote, born a biological male, but identifies as a woman. Now the BBC have now denied that their specific instruction. So it's possible that certain presenters are going

Going on top on their own tangents here, and biological male and biological female for Trans. Men are terms that effectively deny Transit focuses on the body at Birth and then ignores someone sense of inner self and that is highly inappropriate, but if someone doesn't use that term then you don't use it and I object very strongly to be, you know, to those terms because they are that sense of denial. And I mean there's lots of

The things, I mean, as someone of Jewish background heaven forbid, we wouldn't, you know, someone who wasn't Jewish wouldn't just doesn't have the right to call me heaven. Forbid content, note, antisemitism a gas oven candidate, which was what I've sings. I was called at school, that sort of thing and I can't I won't speak for new identities that aren't mine, but I'm sure there are other inappropriate terms for people of color and so on, I'm not going to name those tombs but no one would use them. Surely people

Don't use them without their consent. I would hope not now and I just think it's really ridiculous. That anyone thinks that a person can Define someone else and tell someone else about their sense of self in the first place. It just seems utterly bizarre that that could be the case. But it's always also worth remembering. This is a specific story that a lot of stuff that comes up in a lot of the trans debate.

Thing that I want to re-emphasize, may have mentioned this on the show, listening to a podcast a few weeks ago that to my surprise 25% of social media accounts are Bots or trolls or similar. Yeah, they're not people who are actually that individual will say, this is my definition, sincerely wanting to act on social media with their own views and I've also spoken perhaps at times before how many when I was in Russia, which was

It was around this time. God ten years ago this year? Yes, I was there. I heard from someone who went undercover in a well, a bot Factory or a troll Factory. Now, when you think about it, there has to be somewhere in this in the process of human behind every bot or troll post. Someone has to start them but some people are paid. You could almost think of this as a cross between heaven forbid, a sweatshop and a call center to just go in and put inflammatory posts up and this person.

A side person who went undercover investigated, spoke to some of the people. And some people there. They said, it's the only job I can get. I've got to do it and I go home, and I'm a decent person. And another person on their last day, reversed things and put nice post up instead, which you know, I mean, wouldn't it be nice if we had a benign, billionaire, who had a positive bot Factory to put pro pro trans and pro people of color and pro query

And pro Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander posts up on various various places. Wouldn't that be nice? If anyone knows one, please let us know. So really, really important that we look at things I am, you know, I I believe that the majority of individual citizens are decent people and I'd put that as a very high majority to Kaleidoscope of opinions. And so I just thought I'd mention that and I think that some of the nonsense that we he has to

Pushed back. Like some of the fact that people think they can refer to as someone else in a way. That's not appropriate when I was doing a lot more on the other side of the mic, so to speak doing media representation. For the trans Community, people would say, to me, I was a spokes man. It's like no. Oh, that's what we as a symbol. That's not my job description, or you re writing my organizations job chart and then I will find one person to require mainstream media reports. It, I will have to find a way

A around it so they didn't refer to me as anything. It was Sally. Golden the speaking on behalf of blah blah, blah said this. So I wouldn't it wasn't given a title at all but I just find it bizarre that someone else can tells someone who doesn't have my life experience, can rewrite my story, tell me who I am. Well one story that of course has been around since the 1980s is that of HIV and AIDS? And tomorrow, first of December, is World AIDS day.

Sean was first recognized in 1988 and international day as per Wikipedia dedicated to raising awareness of the AIDS pandemic caused by the spread of HIV infection and morning, those who have passed away from it. And the as per Wikipedia, The acquired immunodeficiency syndrome, AIDS is a life-threatening condition caused by the human. Immunodeficiency, virus HIV, which attacks the immune system.

Mmm, just sometimes something we forget. And so, first conceived in 1987 by James W burn and Thomas Netter to public information officers for the global program on AIDS at the World Health Organization in Geneva, Switzerland, and then approved by dr. Jonathan Mann director of the global program and it was went on 1st December 1988 because

Um, James W Bond, a former TV journalists had recommended that type because it would maximize coverage of the day by Western news media after the u.s. elections but before the Christmas holiday season. So that's a fair enough thing and I oh, I must've been, I had been wondering why we use that day. There we go. Initially focused on children and young people, which of course, anyone theoretically can pass from HIV.

And or, you know, be at will say, open to the possibility, open to experiencing it. But of course, safe-sex safe injecting practices and those sort of things and other health practices which are very standard can pretty much stop that but what I was going to raise and of course it's important and totally want to acknowledge. That HIV has affected in our communities gay and bisexual.

Sexual men and men who have an assigned male. People have a sex with who have sex with assigned male people. I'm deliberately using that word. I don't like the term men having sex with men because it can walk by total coincidence, you know, sort of Miss identify trans women and looking at all the themes. Over the years, there's been communication sharing the challenge Community. Commitment. Children, living in a world where they at.

But there's never been a focus on there was women girls and HIV and AIDS in 2004, but there's never been a focus on HIV and trans people, which I find well, interesting. And what about HIV? And in terms of a sort of trans men, so if we're talking in the course, 99% of whom will not add a phallus. So for trans, man,

Having you know intercourse with Isis man. They could you know who is and one of them has HIV, there's a risk there, so I think it needs to be, you know, translated that's something that maybe we could push for on this station and start that conversation rolling. But it is important that we acknowledge

Now, these things so whatever regardless of who it is. So you know, find out from organizations like Thorn Harbor, Health icon, what they're up to in the next sort of Tomorrow support them. If you can acknowledge it, stop and pause and reflect.

And you know, sort of go ahead and support that because it is really, really important that we remember, you know, there's so many, there are a lot of issues and yes, there's a lot of focus on Trend at the moment but we, you know, sort of do, of course, need to remember this in the last thing I'll say was going back to that period of time where we no one wants to talk about in more, but we can't forget. That was the code when covered was at its worst in 20, 20, and 21. And there was this

It's to get a vaccine and many people who were HIV positive who are hiv-positive or lost loved ones due to HIV. You're saying, you know, here we are racing to get a vaccine in a couple of years but we still don't have an effective one for HIV. There's great medication advances compared to 20 years ago. I remember attending a session with Vanessa Wagner Wear for a day and every few hours you had to

She did the simple analogy that is just a bowl of jelly beans or lollies and she'd ring, a bell, every couple of hours that was the medications. You have to take it slow. Oh, wow. Now things have moved from there but we certainly need more. All right, let's have time for another track. What are we going to do?
