More, you know, sort of a sort of only done when necessary and not just some of the poor or say excuses that they're sort of get, give it used to be given all the child will feeding better at school, who's going to see someone's genitals at school? Let's have better more privacy and changing rooms. All these sorts of things are what we need to be considering Rather than having surgeries that muck up someone for life.

So it was really good to see this legislation being passed, great work by led by intersects Advocates with support of endo. Sex allies might not endow sexy, endo sex, people whose sex characteristics will

say fit societal and medical expectations. Might be one way to describe that and yes the Victorian Parliament passed the landmark legislation after it passed through the lower house, a couple of weeks ago, the legislation passed 24, votes to 15 and star Observer describes it, as passing with multipartisan support. I'm curious as to the 15 who didn't vote for it. I'll have to find out why they didn't do they abstain, or did they know sort of, or is it not oppose or something

and it's, you know, results comes from Decades of advocacy by a whole range of people with variation of sex characteristics. And I feel like dedicating that two people who stood up for intersects past and present someone who was very early, advocate for intersects in the 90s and 2000's was the late. Xavien who introduced me to intersex tiny briefer. Of course, who's been involved with it for years and was there to see the legislation pass other people? Want to pay tribute to Gina Wilson. Who was a founding president of the then organization, intersects Internationale Australia. Now after a couple of name changes intersects human rights Australia and sort of Victoria is now as its, I said, the first state to pass these laws in so-called Australia and only a handful of countries around the world have implemented protections from unnecessary non-consensual surgeries.

So, what will happen now is, they'll be intercept independent assessment panels to oversee treatment for plans for children, born with innate variations of sex characteristics, and more support for parents and clinicians. So it's a win-win. Let's make all make the best decision for all the people involved, the, the person with the variation in their immediate family and the clinicians because I don't no one wants to set out, have a wrong medical decision, then have to sue us a medical professional.

Age of information and choices and they can be loss of sexual function loss of fertility urinary tract issues ongoing medical treatment that was never needed in the first place and these are very, very harmful practices. And so the Victorian Bill includes restrictions on permanent or hard to reverse Medical Treatments of children, or adults. Unable to give informed consent, which is important. And they'll also be an independent expert panel. Made up of people with lived expertise.

It's across medicine, human rights, ethics mental health, for more to oversee, the medical treatment plan. So this is a really good approach. It takes all the expertise works together and that will hopefully prevent some of the surgeries and a lot of the stress, something that stuck in my head. Where people come over from the business sector and not-for-profit sector. And they don't quite appreciate the differences.
