Hard to avoid the ludicrous bill that was introduced into Parliament this week by a Nationals MP. But also, as per the face, the social media posts the report that was released on Friday in to elder abuse in lgbtiqa+ communities. Both specific as specific to lgbtiqa+ people, but also as it relates how does that compare to general elder abuse. So some difficult topics but I thought I'd bunch them in as I said, we'll have some cheery music to counterbalance the difficult topics.

What in the colloquialism was that song? Yes, as a roving reporter has messaged in, on the out of the pan. 855 at gmail line, don't call Wagga Wagga Wagga by Greg champion and probably the lots of the Couldbeen champions as well. Yeah, rip snorter, mate.

And all that well, look, obviously the news of the week is the introduction into Federal Parliament by a Nationals MP of a bill that would reinstate. Definitions of men, man and woman into the federal sex Discrimination Act and well, I'll try to be as balanced as I can. What that might and might not do for Trans people, in terms of protection at a federal level. Now, let's call a spade or shovel from the point of view of trans people 3, CR proudly proactively, taking a pro-trans point of view. And look in my opinion, the only thing that can be said about this bill is that would be damaging to trans people despite the hollow unsubstantiated, exaltations of the Coalition and Alastair Taylor & Co saying, oh no trans people wouldn't be worse. Off Malarkey is the case and Nationals MP Alison. Penfold introduced this private, member's bill into Parliament earlier this week and let's try to get to the gist of it because

Has been an analysis that is publicly available from someone who I consider. Anyway, one of the most reliable human rights legal bloggers in so-called Australia and that is Alastair Lori. And Alastair is a cisgender man, who cisgender person, who is a tireless, you know, Ally for Trans and people with variation of sex characteristics. And so, Alice, dear has said, it makes changes to the in of gender identity, inserts, new definitions of, man, woman and sex. And so, ultimately, this would mean, sex, would assign sex assigned at Birth would Trump gender identity in his opinion and the bill has this bill. Now, let's make it clear. It is a bill. It is not law yet trans woman because it has a section 32A, which says protections for Trans would no longer apply quote, in relation to the provision of sex-based activity.

All services exclusively for women that consists of or include the provision of areas. Ordinarily aren't used only by women such as accommodation prisons, women's shelters lavatory, sanitary facilities or changing rooms or participation in sporting activities or any other activities that are established and operated exclusively for women. So they're going right to the emotive areas that they've been pushing for years. I'll talk about all of that in a second. So if it's sex assigned at Birth which no doubt becomes immutable. Yeah this would also mean trans men would be required to use women services and I'm reminded here of the UK group press for change who used to send a trans man and a trans woman along to so-called women born women, or women's only conferences and say, well, you've got to let one person in you can't let neither in. I mean, if it's a women's only conference and of course these gender

Types of sin are called struggled to let the transmission in but because all looks like a man but you know, then I wouldn't let the transform it in. So so this means trans men would need to use women services in all of those areas listed out and she's going to be an as Alice. This is he a penfold has decided to volunteer herself for the position of national toilet police commissioner Complete with the power to conduct genital examinations, and Alistair goes on to say, this post is on his LinkedIn account. This nonsensical and other objectives that are too strong for LinkedIn. Bill, seems to import the worst elements of the anti transcultural that's been raging in the UK and us for several years. And it tries to amend the fda's current definitions of sexual orientation to reduce out to data terminology of opposite-sex. Now, of course what Also does is whilst this is always an attack on trans. We have to think of our siblings with variations of sex characteristics who will be who are also affected by this war and Morgan Carpenter bioethicist executive. Director of interaction, intersects human rights. Australia said, quote proposals to an act definitions of biological sex, can have an adverse effect on people with intersex. Variations, sometimes people may find themselves in voluntary recall.

Classified out of their birth, observed sex. So yeah, this has far more than the effect. And so this bill is a disaster. Let's be clear about that. Let's get that out of the way. However, before we going to Major Panic, let's look at a few things carefully. The bill was introduced as a private. Member's bill now very few private. Member's bills of any sort regularly, get very far.

In any Australian Parliament, federal, state, or territory. And so what will happen, it's most likely that it'll sit there. It's hardly likely there's going to be enough agreement across both houses of Parliament to move it, much further. So it's more of a rallying cry is alistair's comment, but it

does signify what a future Coalition or liberal National and one nation type of government might see there's no

Question about that. So, you know, if there is time before the next federal election, to make sure that we can do something here and that's where this starts of course right away. And one thing that you can do is write to, at least one member of the House of Representatives or senator in your state particularly labor. Now we know the greens are going to this we know good Senators like David Pocock lower House Independence like Mommy cry

Who a huge congrats to her. If you check her socials, particularly Instagram, she has spoken out against the bill using calm rational language which I'll also come to as well. So these are things we can do and now it's sort of make sure that this just sits there for as long as possible. But the thing is it has to be nipped in the bud and we have to be proactive and we have to find ways to

To counter the nonsense so I'll come back to that in the next segment. Let's have some more. Well, unusual and thought-provoking human type of music. Minister will Ambitions are one thing achieving them is another whether that will happen or not well we've got the powers that's message. I think that's goes is on 3 CR somewhere says we can do something about this and you have brilliantly pointed out. Roving is there feedback from Tim Wilson about this. Bill now is Tim Wilson a real ally of the lgbtqia+ community, Tim Wilson, you know, is sort of someone who declares himself a feminist. Well, let's find out what, you know, how strong a feminist and what sort of a lie he is to transport people. He needs to sort of make sure that he condemns this bill. Let's see if he's got the strength of principle to do that?

Roving's also asked his Pauline delusional, see quotes attached? Let's just have a look at that if we can, if the things going to open look, I don't know if she's delusional. I mean, people genuinely, I suppose believe that, you know, sort of, you know, the thing is with people. And this goes back a long time to Amplified now and days of a more connected world. But as much as all the content not level is pretty high today. We Jo Njelke Peterson used to just apparently ramble incoherently but underneath that, I suppose was a sharp political mind and so you know people like Trump and handstand and others may appear to do that but you know and they won't give direct answers that sort of thing you know sort of ask a question when there are no clouds in the sky. Would you call the the colour that the sky usually is, is blue? Oh, that's that's disingenuous, you know, that sort of thing. So I think maybe that's gives us an answer as to what we need to be trying to do is to pin one thing we can do. Amongst many is pin things down, an openly gay and pee from one nation whose part partner is Muslim, has come out this week. This is over in South Australia and Roving is said scratching my head as to how they be out and proud in a very conservative party. Well, look, there's always the thing with that roving is the old story that the conservatives and conservative political parties, will then go and say seed. Look, we're not prejudiced at all. Look, we've got that one person or, you know, it's the old one of my best friend's is gay type of thing. And of course, that is not the answer. It's you know what they say what they do and what they don't say what they do. And don't do that matters when it comes down to it. And this is where perhaps people who are neurodivergent who are quick to see through what might be called. Bovine X greet a can do as well. But what are other things we can do? Well it's been great to see an organization called not in our name. NION form which is similar to an organization in England, which is an alliance of women, who support trans women. And that's very, very welcome. And I'm not, I'm hoping to catch up with them soon because it's important that that is very quickly get support. And it's been interesting that they've asked for women and organizations to join them in their support. And the support has very quickly, exceeded expectations, I think they only wanted a hundred people to sign the petition at First. And I'm just trying to see where it got up to. I mean, I know it accelerated quickly to 300, but it may be closer to 10,000 now which is very, very welcome. And you know sort of needs to happen very very quickly and just trying to get the website up on that one and I urge queer organizations and an allies of track true allies of trans people women. Yeah, now 300,000 as of this time 12:26 p.m. Australian Eastern Standard Time Sunday, the 31st of May 3657 there. Now aiming for 6400, and as this website action network.org forward, slash forms, nion, women odds, says not in our name, women in support of the trans Community.

We are women from every corner of society. In our name, those who continue to Target this minority group. Do not speak for us. All represent our interests. We call them politicians and media to scoffs stop scapegoating trans people long shared, a spaces and been valued members of our community, and he is a really good point to focus on the real issues of violence and inequalities affecting women and girls, we do not shame or blame any woman who has anxious or uncertain about trans rights, given the media and certain politicians, betraying trans siblings as a threat. Now that's the thing, portrayal want to come back to that, no matter your starting point, we welcome all women to join us in learning together and building in Australia where all our free supported and safe from gender-based expression. Vision is a society where people can all can live their lives with equality. Dignity free from discrimination with inclusive and diverse women spaces that don't police, our looks and proper funding for family and domestic violence Services.

My emphasis on those last few words and goes on to talk about all the various forms of discrimination we have fused, we refuse to allow our experiences to be weaponized against

other women and marginalized, people even more likely to be victims, refused to go along with a culture of gender policing refused to stay silent and they call an Australian politicians and media to recognize the women across the country who are supportive of the trans plus community. So this is just what the proverbial doctor ordered. And I'd urge women to certainly sign that I'm still to find out how men and non-binary people can support this. Maybe there is something sort of something else that can happen there, but it's great to see this being organized and moving. So, you know, going through the proverbial Stratosphere very, very quickly.

What else, as I said, right to your, I think I've, I only feel somewhat too despondent that federal labor has not been assertive enough on this issue in my opinion. I don't believe in just you know ignore it, it will go away. I remember during the 2009-10 Victorian debate on birth certificates where then equality Minister Martin Foley just you know I was able to calmly rebut what was said against the bill so I think that it's that sort of thing that can be done. As I also said right to Federal Labour MPS, and members of the House of Representatives and Senators, usually at least four of each, actually probably closer to eight in each state or territory. Just look at the relevant, parliamentary websites, find out who they are. You can write to at least one of them, find out who nearby House of Representatives members are right to them. And Ask you know, closed questions. Don't give them any wriggle room and all that sort of thing. We have to find out where they stand and make sure they are proactive in shutting this down not just our, it'll go away in the end.

There's no doubt that the Nationals MPS bill is a proverbial, cunning stunt. But the thing is that it is still a publicity-seeking stunt and this is the sneaky ways. These gender criticals operate, they don't seem to get directly into public debate. They sort of sneak around, do a publicity sort of event then come back and sneak a bit more build up their emotion. As one right wing, christian anti-trans, christian groups it out right in relation to bathrooms some years ago. The bathroom debate was in a debate. We concocted to stir up emotions. Well, we need to start pointing out that this is about emotion and where are the facts and what I loved about the nion comment and had the same thoughts earlier in the week, was with great respect to the women and children who are lost. But due to the violent element of cisgender men, which is nothing to do with trans women, you know what, I'd never hear. Gender criticals go on about that element. You know, that I know in here that certain Nationals in Peak I want about so not buying the Malarkey, put everything. Some people say, fact doesn't work in this post truth error. What, certainly can't hurt. And I think it's about how we, you know, sort of get past the emotive generalizations, exaggeration simplifications that have been put out about trans people and start doing about it. Yes, roving. I'm going to say, I better be a little careful here. Tony Abbott. Now, president of the Liberal Party self-sabotage or pure greed and ego. Well, there could be non binary options there. Now, I don't think Tony Abbott is perhaps well-regarded by a lot of the Australian public. Perhaps it shows desperation roving on the liberal parties part that there isn't anyone there. But yeah, I've said and we, where does it leave? The liberal party was where my ADHD brain, was just going very quickly. And, you know, I've long advocated that really if the, what was the traditional, right-of-center really wanted to organize itself, it would just have a smaller Liberal Party and the conservative party. Now, obviously, there's going to be some crossover and it's now there's no, you no, you, no clear-cut.

Andre, it's not like covert with the borders were shut so to speak, but if the right really wanted to organize itself, it would do it that way. But it doesn't it. Cause as you rightly point out, rightly pun intended, point out, it's because of Egos. And well, I should have brought along skyhooks and something about a dirty word, but seriously, it is, that's why Cory Bernardi goes off and tries to form. A conservative party, doesn't work. So now he's with one nation and then he's been, what is it with family? First one, is he with one nation now, which we, which We call we in, but, you know, it's just egos Fred mile, Pauline hats and many others and now, the egos can't work

together which may be from the point of view of the left is a good thing. So there's certainly plenty. You can do as I say talk to your federal labor and peas sign various petitions, you know other things keep pointing at mistruths. The other thing comes across many, many times is when people know a trans person, you know, it's makes things a bit easier. And so, I think most people know, trans people that's something we can do where people comma trying to live our lives Karma who are happened, to who happened to be trans as well. The other thing is said, may have said it before. I'll say it again, doesn't the Coalition have any have any decent, you know, concrete economic policies. Now I know for me, I'm worried about the cost of fuel, the cost of groceries, the cost of accommodation where the rental or mortgage, and I don't know, it's not just about saving for a home. Why aren't we looking at those sorts of things? Would be what I would like to be knowing about they're the sort of things that I think we could consider as well. Yeah, I sort of distressing content in there and no mention of queer five you if you do read it. But yeah, certainly it's one of those things that we've got to talk about because I think there is elder abuse of All Sorts in in aspect of our queer communities. Now, some of it is, of course, similar to elder abuse that the broader population might.

Have, you know, all you know, I don't think that it's queer older people. Let's say, for example, might be more at risk of scams, you know, it can be said that older people can be, you know, sort of a little more trusting of people and there could be, you know, hearing type of issues. Which means if some scammer Rings up over the phone, they perhaps might not pick up on things, you know, lack of awareness of no scams that sort of thing. Although there's lots of good work being done to prevent these sorts of things and minimize

They some these things happening and but you know, lgbtiq, I plus people may face different issues, you know, of elder abuse. And I remember some years ago as, and this is a very high level one, but I think it is in context, where a trans woman was placed into a nursing home. And and however the staff didn't even realize what was going on until they first went to shout the person because the person had been admitted by an adult child who was not supportive of their transparent and had said, well, I won't look up. They had the trans older trans person had been previously in a relationship partner had died and as I say adult child, not supportive and said, well, I'll only care for you.

If you go into Edge care and your old, male name, address and appear and presenters of mail. And then, as I say, when the staff went to shower, the person found out what was going on and we're quite horrified, and their duty of care is to the person in their care. Unfortunately it was on its way to the guardianship board but I'm the person developed either Alzheimer's or dementia and therefore couldn't put get things put a complaint in so I'm never I'm never really sure how it ended.

The other thing, the adult childhood said, well, you won't see your grandchildren again unless you do it this way, but you never brought them anyway. So this is the sort of thing that goes on where it's queer specific to give one example but it can be other things threatening to out people many, I think it's fair to say that. A lot of older trans people are more likely to use the term be in stealth and therefore not wanting to disclose their trans status and that's of course a perfectly reasonable thing for

Listen to any age. They might just want to be men or women as per their sense of inner self and they, you know, they then they get threatened to be out of that sort of thing can happen for others. Of course, we've heard stories of elder abuse and this is still prevalent where people go up into religious aged care, which even though it religion is not exempt from religion, cannot Discriminate against lgbti 30, plus people in federal law in the provision of services for Aged care. You know, some are still doing it. Where, for example, a gay male couple might go into a cathode religious home and they're told either they can't display any signs that they're in a relationship. So they can't even put pictures of themselves together up in their own room or something, or they are put into separate rooms, which of course, is

Highly abusive. So there's all these sorts of things, but it's a very comprehensive report, you know, again, you know, difficult reading many things in there, the summary settled looks at says that the prevalence of older people who have experienced one or five types of the, what a, what is called, what I'm going to summarize is the generalist.

Zeus 14.8% of the broader older population, you know, experienced elder abuse. But the, it was much higher for queer people. I'm just trying to find the exact figure for that and it is much higher. I think it was 27%, no sorry. 36 percent. So two and a half times as much and

Then we've got to look at the specific things that can happen some of which I can mention, which I have mentioned sorry. But also need to be considered and you know queer phobia sexism and specific types of things biphobia lesbo phobia. This is very interesting that the report covers lateral violence, which

Was it says was exploited by some gay and lesbian older people and transgender gender.

Diverse older people. Interesting that it doesn't mention by plus people. I was quite staggered by that, given that older by people have experienced this, including in our communities now. It maybe it wasn't experienced as older people at the time, but I've commented many times on the appalling history of biphobia within Mardi Gras as one thing. So these are

A sort of issues that sort of come into it and then we add it intersectionality. This report certainly, mentions disability as well. And the one thing that you know, will say, quote from my point of view quadruple content note, some lesbians his participants described not being permitted to Advocate and seeks for cisgender. Women only spaces as abuse and mistreatment.

Well, it isn't, you know, like when are we going to get this clear that, you know, up being not allowed to discriminate is not discrimination and but it says, also, this report says some other

queer, participants identify this behaviour is discriminatory against trans or gender diverse women, which linking into the first half of the show should be reminded that 90% of Australians didn't prior to the last election, did not want to see trans people being used as a political football and

And despite what some of the gender critical groups, say their organizations are not representative of lesbians, not representative of lesbian gay, bi people overall should be pointed out that the UK branch of the LGB Alliance, For example, under oath had to admit that only 7% of their members were lesbians, it's just that they're very loud and they've got seems they've got a lot of money behind them, not, you know. So they are able to keep pushing their their publicity stunts.

So there's sort of this seems to be that this event coming back to elder abuse. He has, I say, two and a half times the amount of them compared to the whole population and specific issues, perhaps because of a hole lived, except, you know, older queer people have a lifetime of experience of mistreatment and abuse. And it is a fair thing to say that, the surgeries unwanted surgeries that

Many people with variation of sex characteristics have experienced, you know, would be called abuse as well, so maybe we are aware of it and it's just been covered up. So all sorts of things to consider, anyway, I'll be as I say, I'll put the link for that report into the, the podcast and roving. Yes, some good news.
