And now there's no doubt. Now doubting that sort of artistic Genius of Tim Curry for sure. And the show is, of course, amazing. Good fun. And it is, I think, when you look at it, it's that same

sense of I'm going to say artistic artistic innocence that I was talking about with Dolly, it express something communicated, something that meant something which is not something we see.

Too often a lot in a lot of so-called art nowadays, nowadays, I don't want to sound like a get off your lawn type, but I just do wonder about the commercialization of music and other forms of art nowadays. And you know, that it's just taken over to large and extent and yeah, and I think Tim Curry.

Did this so well in what he did now I'm going to be fair all the same, I do remember one transfer and and this I don't think is really Tim Curry's fault or Rocky Horror Picture, Show spot. I know one Member. One trans friend said to me some time ago all I saw was that and I thought that's not who I wanted to be and that's fair enough. This trans woman, just wanted to be, you know, more on this a woman and didn't want to be

That sort of image, and that, of course, is when you're thinking about it. Now, I totally reports respect her opinion and that's how she her and her right to her feelings. But of course, that's not to my mind. Tim Curry or Rocky Horror Picture shows, fault. And the thing that I'm going to digress, a little onto, here's I sometimes, wonder whether when something like that happens, now probably wouldn't have happened in the 70s with less Communications. How did we send telegrams to people? We didn't even

No, all that sort of thing, paper telegrams not of an app that gets misused nowadays, if there's a generation gap there, huh? But I sometimes think that when people, you know, sort of the more celebrity types, do things, you don't Ideal World that come and talk to The Advocates and say, how can we work together to further each other's aims? And I've certainly remember celebrities, who haven't know people who have been visible for a while who perhaps haven't done that.

And I just think oh you know imagine had it been now the way we both could have fur that each other's aims now, maybe I'm being perfectionist, idealist, which I know I have a tendency to do but I have I'm working on it. The therapy is working. How did I feel about that and all that?

Look at the results of one nation in South Australia. Well and well, it was also Western Australia with the particular by-election over there. Concerning results for a LPN Victoria. And on another note, Jenny said it was listening during lunch break, but secretly working to, we're going to have because I didn't put wasn't able to put one in last week, double wrestling reference today. You need to buy a Drew McIntyre t-shirt Jenny. That's Is bored at work. That's a long story. And there it was at around 12 48 and third 25 seconds, but yeah, look one nation and you might think oh what a downer after talking about people like Tim, Curry and Dolly Parton. Why bring things down? Well, There is actually going to be a linkage here and I think that the sort of values that Dolly Parton exhibited in a way the answer to what we're talking about here. And in one sense, there, what I grew up doing, lets you know, sort of will say, play the ball, not the person. Let's talk about the issues, not comment on people, and I've felt this for Sometime and I during the week have been to a college not have listened to or been online with some sessions on how we could tackle one nation. And I think that, you know, I don't think attacking the person at any time, regardless of the political belief is the right approach. Let's talk about issues, let's get back to that. And what people I want to hear at the same time, it is worth acknowledging. People have strong emotions at the moment. I mean, is fair to say that we haven't really had anything, resembling a good economic situation situation in Australia. Now, for nearly 20 so-called Australia for nearly 20 years and a lot of the, the world and people need to live, they need to buy food. They need to have shelter that sort of thing. And I don't know. Look, you can Argue, is that the system has anyway, really survived the global financial crisis. The situation in 2021? Yes, I'm going to say the word covert. I'm going to say the word, pandemic. They wrecked people emotionally, and now, we live in an uncertain world. All that sort of thing. When people are in a heightened state of emotion, you can turn to what may to someone else.

Here to be dysfunctional ideas. But being prescriptive is not perhaps the answer somehow that acknowledge emotion needs to be acknowledged. So people are angry people feel tired at the moment, they're burnt out. Goodness knows I'd like to be lying on a beach somewhere and all that sort of thing. Instead of facing the day-to-day challenges of life and personal issues in the last few years, all that sort of thing. So you have to acknowledge

How people are feeling, but it doesn't have to be confrontational. And the thing is, you can point people in the right direction. So, we'll okay, you know, you have a right to your opinion. Did you could ask well what makes you believe that? And when you start talking face-to-face to people therein lies the answer and I think sometimes we forget that in this day and age of instant communication, whether we call that internet, social media and

Nothing else that, you know, we could, you know, we forget that we've, you know, since humans began in whatever shape or form a hundred thousand years ago or whatever it was, we've largely communicated in person and suddenly and it's well noted that 100 in the of roughly the hundred percent of communication. 63 percent is body language, 30% is tone of voice and 7%, the words. And I think this is particularly important for neurodivergent people as well, that we perhaps pick up on these things. But unfortunately, of course, we're ridiculed. But when you're in person and people can get all the communication. And now certainly, as much as possible, there's less chance of

Confusion of messaging or deliberately ambiguous messaging. I think that's a really good thing that we need to sort of to do. And so it is about personal conversations and saying, you know, look not saying, hey, politician X, whoever that is. And I'm not going to say who it is is wrong, or they're stupid or they're corrupt. Now, let's get it off that and get back to. Well, look, you know, There is a Vital Information that gives an opposite view. Have you checked it out, you know, where did you get your sources of information? So you're not attacking the person, you're not going to win every argument and you're not going to win an argument perhaps with a total stranger. But you know, you can there is the possibility of making a difference. And I think sometimes those who let's say we disagree with a certain political approach or certain ideological approach we can and feel overwhelmed by the power of that some people appear to wield, well, we can do something about it and so, yes, Jenny to respond to your email directly, what we saw in the secret Harbor by-election and the South Australian election is concerning, but we can be proactive about it and not panic or go into a sense of helplessness. There are things we can do.

And I know people are trying to do things in perhaps that in relevant seats, and that's a good thing. And it's why I've got to say the obvious. We need Independent Media like 3 CR. To just

have the conversations about the issues but have them with the process to give people who let's say, I'm not have different perspectives to what the sort of the end and different processes to what other people are doing. Can have that chance to get their viewpoint across. Now know, not everyone's going to listen to community radio and 3 CR, tongue-in-cheek, your loss, but if we put the podcast of this show out there and someone hears this and goes, oh, I hadn't thought of that, then that's why we're here. So we certainly need to make sure we have freedom of communication of viewpoints, rather than attacking a person or a group of people just for being who they are where it gets to hate speech so we can do things. Now the thing is there is of course in my opinion the the current outrage model is deliberately designed to sort of rev people's emotions up. So the thing is once we try to get past those emotions when we can acknowledge them and just I will hang on, let's look at things logically. We can do it, we have that possibility. And yeah, look the reality is most people in Australia, I think a concerned about cost of living pressures, fuel housing, rental or mortgage food, those sorts of things job security. They're the things that are bothering people, and, of course, let's remember. Logically that 80% plus of Australians, close to 90% on some parts of the the research. Dare, I say the science, we have on it say that trans people want just want to deserve to live with dignity and have a fair go and all that sort of thing. So we can we can achieve these things and frame the debate while also.

They of course, trans and Allied people have a right to stand up for herself and people of color Aboriginal Torres Strait. Islander we don't have to silence these debates at all, but we can frame it in a way that will communicate with people and use basic values. And this is where we bring It, full circle the same way that Dolly Parton did. I had better get out of here and make way for freedom of species and on today's program,
