But I think it is almost a bit surprising, even a little sad that maybe it's taken that long to have to have one, but the question I suppose, yeah, there's definitely been people organized bisexual people within the HIV movement or housing and stuff but I think there was an incredible HIV and bisexual Advocate Steve Spencer who was the driver behind the beauty is the one of the acronym again the by sexual health and HIV study and the study fish, a lot of this leadership and advocacy. We just saw that need and that more and more visibility was important but the unique challenges that people with HIV that foot fit under the bypass umbrella are so unique. You know, we know, their increased vulnerability is run physical and sexual violence. Poor mental health are all of this stuff that I'm sure we'll dive into. But yeah, it was really important to have this space created and it's been such a privilege to watch Community come that have been living with HIV for a long time. Where you've got well let's say cold calculating legal type, cross-examining you for every Dot and calmer and all that sort of thing, and all the rest of it. And then, well, I will say the approach of Sall Grover refusing to acknowledge pronouns or appropriate terminology and all that sort of thing and even in a court setting. I just find that to be really, really sad. And I haven't read every last transcript of it, but it sounds like there was a lot of contempt going on from what I would consider a reasonable balance transfer spective at times is just amazing, but it certainly puts the proverbial kibosh on any further legal challenge in Australia. It's not can't go to the can't go further in terms of what I'll call the broad thrust of anti-discrimination Law and given that federal law override state. It means that and this is a laypersons opinion, I would hasten to add, I do not claim to be a lawyer but the broad thrust of day-to-day good.

And services for Trans and gender diverse people that underlying Foundation of protection is intact. Now, what doesn't this case cover? This was not about sports. So the at the federal level, there is a separate exemption for sport from the law that you can treat. Someone unfavorably. If there is an advantage of strength, stamina and physique and that has to my knowledge, never been tested in any Australian Court state.

Territory or federal. So that was not touched in my and so that is not tested and it's nothing to do with religious belief either. This was not a religious setting. So in that sense, that is not a factor either. So they remain and it's why we should be in my opinion, massively reducing religious exemptions at All-State territory Federal

Abel's save obviously. For the exception that is hiring of religious officials in places of worship, course that has to be someone of the appropriate religion. Also miss Simpson would say Dole. Joy FM on Saturday magazine on the 5th of September and I listened to the interview and now this very to very clear parts to this. I'm going to read, Jenny's email to me in for 1st. Hi Sally. I'm sorry. I'll start that again, begin quote marks. Hi Sally, here is my letter published today in the age about Tim Wilson being on Joy FM. He had a lot of things to say, but it's his sneering attitude, that would become accustomed to over many years that's problematic. Even towards Laine. Hanson always, and let you listen to his interview with Maca and other prison, I'm sorry intervening here, other presenters, resume quote, and you can make up your own mind as you didn't hold back. And then there's a link to the interview. She is Jenny, Jenny has attached her letter to the age, which was published. So there's two parts. This, there's some remarks for me about the issue of trans women that I find. Well, as I said to quote Ian Chappell a real disappointment,

Movement to put it on somewhat something to diplomatic there. But we are only nine, eleven days away from the brand season, the height of diplomacy Jenny's letter to the age reads and is headed up by the age. Listen, Tim Wilson, then begins. I listen to Tim Wilson on community radio yesterday and find out. While I find one nation erratic and devoid of substance his disparaging remarks about Pauline Hanson. Only adds fuel to the fire of her support base. It's

this time of type of elitism that is alienated their own base for many years and was led to this rise in equal in equality, amongst many other social factors. Please, listen to the frustrations of ordinary Aziz. They are angry and deserve your respect. Not a sneering attitude, Jenny Smith, East Melbourne. Yeah. So there's the tone, but I first and foremost want to go through some remarks Tim made about the issue of trans in terms of the law and I have listened back. I hopefully have got every word that was said, if not word for word, then very close without and certainly not changing any meaning, I've taken the gums and eyes out. So a presenter asked in relation to the current laws that Define trans at a federal level. I point out this interview was before the outcome of the tickle versus giggle case the presenter ice. Where do you stand on that? And can you guarantee you won't support a bill that narrows that definition Tim replies. What I support is clarifying the law because we've had a series of federal High Court decisions Federal Court decisions which have led to ambiguity about the definition, definition of ultimately, what a woman is. First of all know, that's not the case in my opinion because the case of Kevin's case as it was called in 2004, Kevin was a trans man since then, even before we had the Federal

All law, the statutory statutory law, parliamentary law in place at a federal level, Kevin's case said Kevin was a trans man was quote, a man in the ordinary sense of the word and obviously, for transwomen the same would apply and that's really what we're talking about. There's been multiple cases and law since I don't agree with that and I don't understand what the lack of clarity is. Tim goes on to say, quote,

I absolutely believe there is a distinction between a biological woman and how people choose choose to present themselves and identity. Well, biological woman is and biological man, in my opinion, are terms that are used to erase trans and gender diverse people and Define and arrays, gender, and Define people solely by sex, which of course is also not accurate when we consider variation of sex characteristics. But the fact that Tim will

Even someone who in the past, has claimed to be analysis, choose to present themselves on a think, the meaning would be as an identity. Our sense of gender identity is an innate sense of self. The same exactly 180 degrees parallel to someone sexual and romantic orientation, and regardless of who is saying this that just needs to be called out as inaccurate. And to great also disrespectful to trans people Tim, then goes on to say and I quote, there's physiological difference. It's not them. It's a matter of science. Not of opinion. Once again, confusing, sex, and gender, and relegates denies gender identity. And, you know, as I always say, when we get heterosexual, people to prove themselves in terms of sexual orientation, and when we get cisgender and for that matter, Endo sex people to prove themselves and prove that the who they are, who they are, then we might go into science. But this idea that we people have to prove themselves half of it because there's science is to me again, a diversion tactic that takes us back to the old lifestyle Choice thing that we used to hear about 30 years ago. The next words, we hear and the law has to respect the right of women to form communities as transgender Australian should be able to form communities of their, right. And exclude people as, by the way, gay men G. There's a word called intersectionality. I am a trans woman. I might want to mix with trans people. I might want to with women and other things. And I'm not going to mix with both and this idea that I should be, you know, separated into a sort of well almost ghetto of some sort and I'm perhaps being a little bold in using that word and some people say, oh that's disrespectful, but it's how I'm being treated, I'm being sectioned off, it might be a nicer way to put it paps. Not as strong is really abysmal. I am a woman.

One and my sense of identity is just as important as any biological factors to relegate it, to make it, put it in second place is not on and it in in ignores gender orientation. Anything goes on. Now, let's just linked back here. Should be able to form communities of their right and as heterosexual men could, now, I must admit I haven't heard of where heterosexual men, who, if we're just talking sexuality and gender identity as far as I'm aware, are at the top of the privilege chain. I don't know why they need to form their own communities. What are they unsafe? Just for being

heterosexual? Men, no, dearie me. Then goes on to say, should be able to inform the community, so I believe there should be already in the law. So if people form to choose communities, they say fit, but that's respected. I'm not really sure what that really means.

The presenter. Then another presenter says, we've got some of the best laws in the world that do give clarification and it protects my not like the presenter using biological woman in a much greater way. In this definition that was trying to be narrowed down would actually take away some of the political privileges of why, Audrey of. Well, don't like this real woman's I, you know, identities to which the response is, I don't agree with that. Well, they are good laws. And now again, remembering that this interview that I'm

Quoting happened before. Thursday's High Court announcement, the law is now. Abundantly clear trans women are women can't be any clearer but Tim's response was, I don't agree with that, but with no detail, given why don't you agree with that? It's not clear. Let's cut through all the emotion and the imported rhetoric, and the Bots, and the trolls, and all the rest of it, this paranoia about safe spaces, trans women.

Are no more of a threat than anyone. This idea that someone's going to put a cisgender man, is going to somehow pretend to be a woman to get in to a woman save space. I am yet to hear of any verifiable evidence. We're in the case of a woman's shelter that has happened, and it's not going to happen, because we've had trans laws in parts of Australia for 40 years, For Heaven's Sake and it's never

And those laws have gradually increased the coverage of the trans Kaleidoscope. We then go on to say the presenter says, there's two not been to me in terms of all the bills. That one Nations and Coalition, people have entered into Parliament. The presenter says, yeah, too many for an issue that shouldn't be debated to, which the response is, you'll find no ambiguity with me. This is not at the top of my political agenda, but where the courts ambiguity, create ambiguity in the law. Well, they haven't.

And it's always, it's been as I say, abundantly, clear this for 22 years. Now, it's double abundantly clear. It's the responsibility of parliament to draw distinction. Well, no, they didn't. And I'd remind people that the federal Parliament voted on voices in 2013 to bring in the federal anti-discrimination law. After every state and territory had had anti-discrimination law protecting trans people. As I said at that point in 2013 for nearly 30 years and

They've never been this flowering of moon pretending to be women and how do we get the balance in the law, right? To protect the safety of women and in women's shelters Here We Go. Again, where's the independent evidence? This just plays to emotion and fear and then wait for this and I'd be horrified if someone anybody thought that women should feel unsafe for women's shelters because of how people choose to present.

Themselves also, sis women, who Society. Not the I like these words might appear masculine would be excluded and that Joy presenter then says, it's a big discussion point for another another show. And it's one and the response is, it's one of those ones with these know, kind of it's a non binary answer. You've got to have Nuance. Well, yes, you've got a thing. I know that's hard for a lot of people nowadays in this Century, but let's try. But what does that mean?

Come from a place of compassion and logic. It's actually freaking Bloody easy. And then we go on to hear about how right come with responsibilities. And we need to kind of a conversation about how X how to exercise responsibilities. Yes. Well everyone everyone needs to do that equally for lack of much better words on both sides. I don't see very many gender criticals and magaz exercising responsibility.

So you have certainly a very arrogant tone and normally I wouldn't comment on the person but this is a public figure and this is the part that really beats me up overall. I feel really sad. And once again following from the product quality project debacle just under 12 months ago about a lack of learning here because we've had cisgender men. As far as I know, I don't know the identity of one of the joys of presenters debating women's and

And issues without women and trans people present, btfo, in my opinion. And I feel concerned that yet again, this is the thing that really gets me is people who may be perceived as authoritative, because there's this idea, I will guys know all about the trans and they'll always do the right thing by them, which we know isn't the case for Trans and by and intersex and others. And once again, this has been inaccurately represented and it's not good enough. So coming back, I'm Jenny very quickly to the tone. Yes certainly very arrogant Agent dismissive vague in my opinion. And I think we can get better leadership from politicians of all sorts. And it really well to link in with the show from two weeks ago, it comes down to, in my opinion, toxic masculinity, just noting your email in today about a win for Mari, cauce, tikides and freedom of speech and yes, something that the criticizes a policy. Not a group of people is there. Anyway, I'm running out of time. I'd better get out of here and make way for freedom of species and their

Topic on the programme today is systemic and individual actions to create social change. Which I'm sure will have many a proverbial transferable skill for all many of the listeners and ideas discussed on 3, CR. I will go out and we can all go out and just have a little bit of a breather. Take it out today, because of the other thing, we can celebrate is the beautiful Springtime weather. Let's have a little bit of dancing with a Fiesta from Tommy Emmanuel from the determination album.
